

James and John, the sons of Zebedee, came to Jesus and said to him, "Teacher, we want you to do for us whatever we ask of you." He replied, "What do you wish me to do for you?"

They answered him, "Grant that in your glory we may sit one at your right and the other at your left."

Jesus said to them, "You do not know what you are asking.

Can you drink the cup that I drink or be baptized with the baptism with which I am baptized?"

They said to him, "We can."

Jesus said to them, "The cup that I drink, you will drink, and with the baptism with which I am baptized, you will be baptized;

but to sit at my right or at my left is not mine to give but is for those for whom it has been prepared."

What's Involved Here?

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

Twice a year we offer Pre-Cana here in our parish. That's when engaged couples gather with married couples who share their experiences on a variety of marital topics (for the record, engaged couples arrive skeptical and, thanks to our great Pre-Cana Team, they always leave really glad they came). I usually open the Friday night session with a talk on the meaning of marriage as a Sacrament.

Last month, as I was going through the vows with the engaged couples, I told them: "You will promise to love each other in good times and in bad, in sickness and in health." Then I added: "And you will have absolutely no idea what you are promising." We all laughed. The truth can be funny.

Truth is, when we say we are Christians, disciples of Jesus, when we say we believe in Christ and follow Him, we probably don't know exactly what we are in for. The first disciples didn't have a clear idea, as we hear about once again in this Sunday's gospel passage from Mark (10:35-45).

To follow Jesus means to live differently, to live by a set of values different from the world's. Listen to Jesus:

"You know that those who are recognized as rulers over the Gentiles lord it over them, and their great ones make their authority over them felt. *But it shall not be so among you.*"

It won't be that way among you. Jesus is pretty emphatic here. His disciples will live differently. They will be servants; after all, Jesus himself came into our world not to be served, but to serve.

Jesus is saying, I think, there is another way of doing things. But when we Christians don't live any differently, when our leaders don't lead any differently, when Christian business persons don't do business any differently ... Christian lawyers, politicians, educators, bankers, nurses, teammates, parents, siblings ... you name it ... if we don't live any differently than those who do not believe, then, how can we say we honestly follow Jesus?

Of course, none of us are perfect — least of all me. But the Gospels we have heard recently should really get all of us thinking about the sincerity and depth of our discipleship. Peace!





Lauren spoke with me when she was waiting for her ride home. She said she changed her mind and told me her story. She showed me the "picture" she got. I asked if she needed help, but she said no. She said, "Thank you for being here. It really made me think".

I had just gotten there about 10 minutes before. It wasn't me who made her think. The point is that somebody was there being Christ's Hands and Feet. And because that person was there a baby who was scheduled to die today will live. He might live 80 or more years – only God knows.

Your peaceful presence can make all the difference in the world to a baby and to his/her mother, father, siblings, grandparents, aunts, uncles and cousins. It can make all the difference to their future spouse and children or to others that may help during their time here on earth. God has given this baby gifts and talents which he or she will now be able to develop and share.
