GOSPEL LUKE 1:1-4, 4:14-21

Since many have undertaken to compile a narrative of the events that have been fulfilled among us, just as those who were eyewitnesses from the beginning and ministers of the word have handed them down to us, I too have decided, after investigating everything accurately anew, to write it down in an orderly sequence for you, most excellent Theophilus, so that you may realize the certainty of the teachings you have received.

Jesus returned to Galilee in the power of the Spirit, and news of him spread throughout the whole region. He taught in their synagogues and was praised by all.

He came to Nazareth, where he had grown up, and went according to his custom into the synagogue on the sabbath day.

He stood up to read and was handed a scroll of the prophet Isaiah.

He unrolled the scroll and found the passage where it was written:

The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me to bring glad tidings to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim liberty to captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to let the oppressed go free, and to proclaim a year acceptable to the Lord.

Rolling up the scroll, he handed it back to the attendant and sat down, and the eyes of all in the synagogue looked intently at him.

He said to them,

"Today this Scripture passage is fulfilled in your hearing."

The "Wow" Factor

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

Have you ever found yourself walking into church and just going through the motions? (Hopefully not too often!) Has Mass ever become something that is just "ho-hum?" Something we just do out of habit or because we're told to do it? This probably isn't anything new. Maybe it was even happening in our Gospel today. Jesus gets up to proclaim the Sacred Scripture. Some folks are probably fidgeting, some drifting off, some thinking about what needs to be done later that day when they get home. Some are listening, perhaps nodding their heads in agreement as they hear the words which have been proclaimed to them over and over throughout the generations. Only this time Jesus ZAPS them. I mean he really knocks their socks off! He tells them that the passage they have just heard is *fulfilled* in their hearing ... in other words, *Jesus* is the fulfillment.

We get Jesus every Sunday. At every Mass. Today Jesus speaks to us in Scripture and wants us to be "WOWED" as His first listeners were.

Every time we come into church and hear the word of God and receive the body of Christ we should be filled with excitement and empowered by the Spirit so as to go forth, proclaim, and be what we have heard and received. There's nothing ho-hum about the liturgy. It should inspire joy, determination, and commitment. Jesus is actually speaking to you! Jesus is sharing with you his Body! Jesus is here, fully alive and waiting for you to be awed and inspired by his presence!

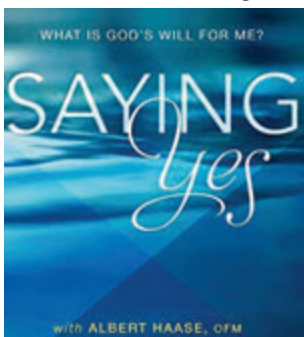

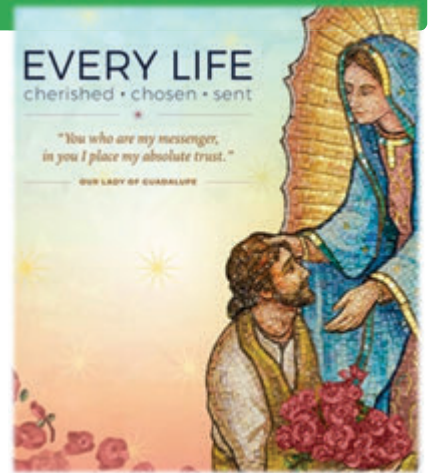
