INCLEMENT WEATHER POLICY & other helpful info

Hopefully we won't have to use the following policy. But in case of inclement weather and you wonder whether Mass or a meeting or program is cancelled or not, this is the rule of thumb we will follow:

MONDAY THRU FRIDAYS:

If EVESHAM TOWNSHIP SCHOOLS are cancelled, Daily Mass and ALL scheduled events and meetings are cancelled (this includes Religious Education classes).

WEEKENDS:

Sunday Mass will only be cancelled in the event that the Governor has issued a State of Emergency permitting only emergency/rescue vehicles on the roads.

If you are unsure, we will leave a message on the phone system and on our parish website, as well as Facebook and Twitter.

This is important: please always use your best judgment and common sense. Trust your instinct: if you think the weather is too bad for you to go out in it, please stay home. Broken hips are not required to follow Jesus.

Related to this: if you are sick or do not feel well, you are certainly not required to come to Mass. You are not committing a sin if you stay home because of illness — in fact, it is more prudent to stay home.

Sign of Peace: If you have a cold or are not feeling well, please share a sign of peace during Mass with a nod of your head, a friendly smile or a wave.

Remember, too: those who are 62 years of age and over are not required to fast one hour before receiving Holy Communion. Nor is anyone who has health issues. ~Thank you!

Twelfth Day Of Christmas

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

We get lucky this year because the twelfth day of Christmas, January 6th, the actual feast of the Epiphany, happens to fall on a Sunday! So: HAPPY EPIPHANY!

For many in the world, this is the day to exchange gifts which makes sense, if you think about it. We are so grateful for your many cards, best wishes, gifts, baked goods and cookies (too many to count, but not too many to enjoy). Thank you!

Likewise, thank you to the many persons who helped make our Advent and Christmas liturgies so beautiful — from decorators to cleaners to our maintenance staff; cantors, musicians, choir members; lectors and Eucharistic ministers; ushers and greeters; liturgy planners and the evangelization team. It has been a wonderful Christmas and — good news! — the liturgical season doesn't officially end until next Sunday with the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord.

Epiphany is also a great day to thank all of you, the parishioners of St. Joan of Arc, for being the great gift you are to me and to all the clergy and sisters of our parish. It is an honor and privilege to live here with you and to serve God by your side. As we take the first steps into the new year, we look forward to working with you to continue the ministry of Jesus Christ. As we make our list of resolutions for 2019, I urge us all to make our relationship with Jesus Christ a top priority. Let's recommit our lives to the Gospel. Let's deepen our resolve to live as faithful disciples of Christ in our daily lives, in the decisions we make, in the relationships we forge. In everything we think, say and do, let's give glory and honor to God!

GOSPEL MATTHEW 2:1-12

After Jesus had been born at Bethlehem in Judaea during the reign of King Herod, suddenly some wise men came to Jerusalem from the east asking, 'Where is the infant king of the Jews? We saw his star as it rose and have come to do him homage.'

When King Herod heard this he was perturbed, and so was the whole of Jerusalem.

He called together all the chief priests and the scribes of the people, and enquired of them where the Christ was to be born.

They told him, 'At Bethlehem in Judaea, for this is what the prophet wrote:

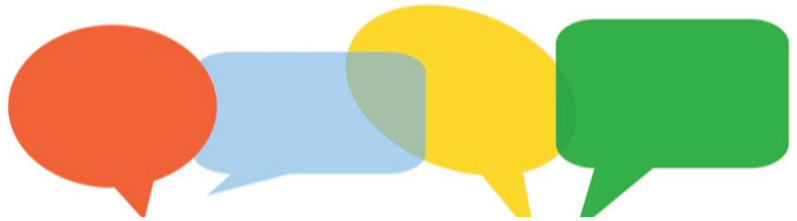
And you, Bethlehem, in the land of Judah, you are by no means the least among the leaders of Judah, for from you will come a leader who will shepherd my people Israel.'

Then Herod summoned the wise men to see him privately. He asked them the exact date on which the star had appeared and sent them on to Bethlehem with the words, 'Go and find out all about the child, and when you have found him, let me know, so that I too may go and do him homage.'

Having listened to what the king had to say, they set out. And suddenly the star they had seen rising went forward and halted over the place where the child was.

The sight of the star filled them with delight, and going into the house they saw the child with his mother Mary, and falling to their knees they did him homage. Then, opening their treasures, they offered him gifts of gold and frankincense and myrrh.

But they were given a warning in a dream not to go back to Herod, and returned to their own country by a different way.



We hope you take the time of sharing the gospel, reflection, and questions with your family, your friends, and others as you engage people everywhere.

May the peace, challenge and growth we experience as we share God's word help us become good and faithful servants....

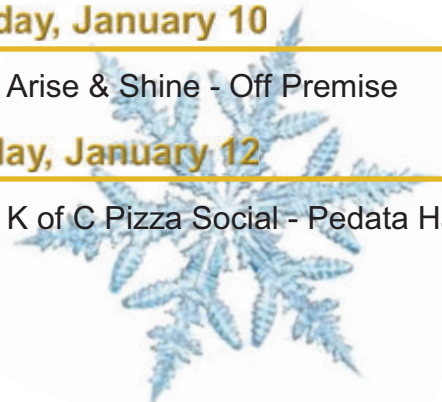
