### "This is My Chosen Son"

For the second time in the Gospel of Luke the voice of God claims Jesus as God's son.

The first moment was at his baptism when "the holy Spirit descended upon him in bodily form" (Luke 3:22 — we actually heard this story not so long ago on the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord on January 13th). At that time the voice of God proclaimed, "You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased."

At the Jordan River the voice from heaven speaks directly to Jesus, but on the mountain where Jesus goes to pray with his closest companions the voice addresses those around Jesus — Peter, James and John — telling them: "This is my chosen Son, listen to him."

These words are addressed to us when we encounter our Lord in the Word and the Eucharist, "Behold, here is Jesus, the chosen one, listen to him."


Before his Transfiguration occurs, we are told in Luke's Gospel that Jesus takes the three disciples — Peter, James and John — "up the mountain to pray."




