GOSPEL JOHN 20:19-31

On the evening of that first day of the week, when the doors were locked, where the disciples were, for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood in their midst and said to them, "Peace be with you." When he had said this, he showed them his hands and his side. The disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord. Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you." And when he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained."

Thomas, called Didymus, one of the Twelve, was not with them when Jesus came. So the other disciples said to him, "We have seen the Lord." But he said to them, "Unless I see the mark of the nails in his hands and put my finger into the nailmarks and put my hand into his side, I will not believe."

Now a week later his disciples were again inside and Thomas was with them. Jesus came, although the doors were locked, and stood in their midst and said, "Peace be with you." Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here and see my hands, and bring your hand and put it into my side, and do not be unbelieving, but believe." Thomas answered and said to him, "My Lord and my God!" Jesus said to him, "Have you come to believe because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and have believed."

Now Jesus did many other signs in the presence of his disciples that are not written in this book. But these are written that you may come to believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that through this belief you may have life in his name.

"Continuing the Blessings" Small Group Discussion Questions:

- 1.In today's first reading the Apostles carry on the work of Jesus, performing signs and wonders as the Holy Spirit enables them. We are to carry on Jesus' work as well. How do you proclaim the good news of the resurrection in your every day life?
- 2.Jesus tells the disciples "Peace be with you" three times in the gospel. Where in your life are you in need of the peace of the Lord?
- 3. How do you offer peace in your words & actions to others?
- 4.We are offered mercy & told to offer it to others. Who is need of mercy in your life? How might you offer them this gift?

SECOND SUNDAY OF EASTER/MERCY SUNDAY 2019 ACTS-ING UP!

Dear Parishioners and Friends:

For the next seven Sundays, instead of a passage from the Old Testament (the Hebrew Scriptures), our first reading is going to be from the Acts of the Apostles. Every Easter Season (which is 50 days long — lasting until the great Feast of Pentecost). In the Acts of the Apostles, written by Luke (the same Luke who wrote the third Gospel), we hear the story of the early days of Christianity.

When you read Acts, you can't help but notice that the first followers of Jesus are incredulous with joy and that joy is infectious. All throughout the book, you will come upon phrases like this one we hear from today's selection: "Yet more than ever, believers in the Lord, great numbers of men and women, were added to them."

If the Acts of the Apostles was a Mathematics Book, the vast majority of the lessons would be on addition and multiplication. Because of the joyful witness of the first disciples, more and more people come to believe in Jesus as Lord and Savior and more and more are added to the numbers of the early Church. (Any division in the early Church — and there certainly was some — is dealt with honestly, directly and respectfully).

Joy multiplies. This is a great lesson for us today. We can't rest on our "Easter laurels." We can't act like "everything's over" once we put away Lent and Holy Week and the Triduum for another year. The 50 days of Easter isn't meant to be "time to take a breather." It's meant to be an intensification of the joy we experienced on Easter Sunday morning! The Alleluias must grow louder and the light must grow brighter!

This is why we are planning a big event this Wednesday night, May 1st. We are going to do Mass a bit differently (a littler teaser!). We will meet and welcome the newly initiated. And we will celebrate the Eucharist like the two disciples did who went to Emmaus. You can read more about it in this bulletin.

Let the joy begin!!


