FOURTH SUNDAY OF LENT/2019 PARABLE PAR EXCELLENCE

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

A parable is a short story with a big message ... about God and God's Kingdom. The parable we hear today, the Prodigal Son, Luke 15:11-32, is arguably the most famous of all the stories Jesus told (along with the Good Samaritan). This parable is worth a long discussion or two at our dinner tables this week, in our small groups, in the car taking the kids to practice.

The common title — "The Prodigal Son" — highlights the selfishness, sinfulness, and ultimate conversion of the younger son. Some call it the "Parable of the Two Lost Sons." That's certainly appropriate. Also appropriate is "The Merciful Father." Which title do you like best and why? That's something you could discuss this week.

Also: Where do you see yourself in the story?

Jesus doesn't give us an ending. Does the older son join the celebration or not? What do you think?

What does the parable say to you about God?

Read the story a couple of times throughout the week. Let it stay with you. Let it guide you and your conversations this week. Could provide for interesting discussions. Might even change someone's (even our own) understanding of who God is. Might even deepen our own relationship with God ... exactly what a parable is supposed to do.

Good Lent!

GOSPEL LUKE 15:1-3, 11-32

Tax collectors and sinners were all drawing near to listen to Jesus, but the Pharisees and scribes began to complain, saying, "This man welcomes sinners and eats with them." So to them Jesus addressed this parable: "A man had two sons, and the younger son said to his father, 'Father give me the share of your estate that should come to me.' So the father divided the property between them.

After a few days, the younger son collected all his belongings and set off to a distant country where he squandered his inheritance on a life of dissipation. When he had freely spent everything, a severe famine struck that country, and he found himself in dire need. So he hired himself out to one of the local citizens who sent him to his farm to tend the swine. And he longed to eat his fill of the pods on which the swine fed, but nobody gave him any. Coming to his senses he thought, 'How many of my father's hired workers have more than enough food to eat, but here am I, dying from hunger. I shall get up and go to my father and I shall say to him, "Father, I have sinned against heaven and against you. I no longer deserve to be called your son; treat me as you would treat one of your hired workers."'

So he got up and went back to his father. While he was still a long way off, his father caught sight of him, and was filled with compassion. He ran to his son, embraced him and kissed him.

His son said to him, 'Father, I have sinned against heaven and against you; I no longer deserve to be called your son.' But his father ordered his servants, 'Quickly bring the finest robe and put it on him; put a ring on his finger and sandals on his feet. Take the fattened calf and slaughter it. Then let us celebrate with a feast, because this son of mine was dead, and has come to life again; he was lost, and has been found.'

Then the celebration began.

Now the older son had been out in the field and, on his way back, as he neared the house, he heard the sound of music and dancing. He called one of the servants and asked what this might mean.

The servant said to him, 'Your brother has returned and your father has slaughtered the fattened calf because he has him back safe and sound.'

He became angry, and when he refused to enter the house, his father came out and pleaded with him.

He said to his father in reply, 'Look, all these years I served you and not once did I disobey your orders; yet you never gave me even a young goat to feast on with my friends. But when your son returns who swallowed up your property with prostitutes, for him you slaughter the fattened calf.'

He said to him, 'My son, you are here with me always; everything I have is yours. But now we must celebrate and rejoice, because your brother was dead and has come to life again; he was lost and has been found.'"

- 3- How might you give these feelings to the Lord? How might you seek reconciliation?
- 4- At this point in our Lenten Journey, how are you living the practice of forgiving?


