# **GOSPEL LUKE 10:25-37**

There was a scholar of the law who stood up to test Jesus and said, "Teacher, what must I do to inherit eternal life?" Jesus said to him, "What is written in the law? How do you read it?" He said in reply,

"You shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your being, with all your strength, and with all your mind, and your neighbor as yourself." He replied to him, "You have answered correctly; do this and you will live."

But because he wished to justify himself, he said to Jesus, "And who is my neighbor?" Jesus replied, "A man fell victim to robbers as he went down from Jerusalem to Jericho. They stripped and beat him and went off leaving him half-dead. A priest happened to be going down that road, but when he saw him, he passed by on the opposite side. Likewise a Levite came to the place, and when he saw him, he passed by on the opposite side. But a Samaritan traveler who came upon him was moved with compassion at the sight. He approached the victim, poured oil and wine over his wounds and bandaged them. Then he lifted him up on his own animal, took him to an inn, and cared for him. The next day he took out two silver coins and gave them to the innkeeper with the instruction, 'Take care of him. If you spend more than what I have given you, I shall repay you on my way back.' Which of these three, in your opinion, was neighbor to the robbers' victim?" He answered, "The one who treated him with mercy." Jesus said to him, "Go and do likewise."

#### 15<sup>™</sup> SUNDAY OF ORDINARY TIME/2019 **PUSHING THE ENVELOPE**

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

The Good Samaritan. Hospitals and hospices are named for this parable. We call strangers who do good deeds "good Samaritans." It has entered our popular lexicon. People know what a good Samaritan is even if they don't know where the phrase originated.

We know, of course. It was Jesus. In Luke's Gospel, chapter 10, Jesus tells the parable (a short story with a big message) about a Samaritan, regarded as an enemy, who stops to care for a man beaten and dying. Jesus tells the story as a reply to the question: "Who is my neighbor?"

This is what many folks — even Christians — sometimes miss. Jesus is pushing the envelope here, expanding our understanding of who our neighbor is. Being a good Samaritan isn't just doing a kind deed for a stranger. Rather, it is treating even an enemy as a human being, not as an object, a thing, a problem, an inconvenience, or an opponent.

Who is my neighbor? Who is your neighbor? What if we as individuals, as a parish, as a country saw people through the lens of this story by Jesus? How would that change the way we deal with one another? How would it change the way we speak about others? How would it change the emails we send? How would it change public policy? How would it change our laws?

### BURLINGTON COUNTY DIOCESAN RESPECT LIFE NEWS

The NJ Assembly has passed healthcare bill (A5508/ S3804) which is now in the Senate and could become law in a short time if signed by the Governor. The law would have a grave impact on religious liberty if enacted. This law would expand insurance coverage for abortion inducing drugs and eliminate the religious employers' exemption contained in New Jersey public law. By removing the religious employers' exemption, Catholic parishes, schools and other religious institutions would be forced to provide insurance coverage for abortion inducing drugs.
