

29th SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME FAITH HOPE...PERSISTANCE?

Dear Parishioners and Friends:

St. Paul said, "So, faith, hope and love remain, these three, and the greatest of these is love" (1st Corinthians 13:13). You've probably heard this at a wedding recently. This Sunday, however, our Scriptures speak of faith, hope and *persistence*.

In Jesus' short parable (Luke 18:1-8) we meet one very persistent (perhaps even annoying) widow. She will not give up. She badgers and bothers a judge into delivering a just decision. Where does her remarkable persistence and stamina come from?

Hope. She is the most hopeful woman we meet in all of Jesus' stories. Her hope for what is right is so strong it drives her into action. Even when it doesn't look like things aren't going her way, she remains hopeful ... and therefore persistent.

Just last Tuesday evening, at our monthly Adult Faith Enrichment presentation (if you don't go to these, you should give them a try), our guest speaker said this: **"Hope magnifies the will."** Ah. Brilliant. In other words, hope gives us the strength to decide to remain steadfast in the face of adversity and opposition, in the face of disappointment or failure, even in the face of rejection or hurt.

Persistence is born of hope.

And hope — not just optimism — comes from faith. Faith in a God who promises to always be with us is the source of my hope.

If you think about it, how could there be love without hope? How could there be love without persistence?



FAITH TO MOVE MOUNTAINS UPDATE

As a parish community, we owe a debt of gratitude to those in our community who supported the Diocese of Trenton's Endowment Campaign called **FAITH TO MOVE MOUNTAINS** (FTMM).

As you may recall, 30% of all donations to the Campaign were returned to us. To date, 477 parishioners have pledged \$1.35 million and we have received \$345,678.31 in rebates from the Diocese!


