GOSPEL LUKE 19:1-10

At that time, Jesus came to Jericho and intended to pass through the town. Now a man there named Zacchaeus, who was a chief tax collector and also a wealthy man, was seeking to see who Jesus was; but he could not see him because of the crowd, for he was short in stature. So he ran ahead and climbed a sycamore tree in order to see Jesus, who was about to pass that way. When he reached the place, Jesus looked up and said, "Zacchaeus, come down quickly, for today I must stay at your house." And he came down quickly and received him with joy. When they all saw this, they began to grumble, saying, "He has gone to stay at the house of a sinner." But Zacchaeus stood there and said to the Lord, "Behold, half of my possessions, Lord, I shall give to the poor, and if I have extorted anything from anyone I shall repay it four times over." And Jesus said to him, "Today salvation has come to this house because this man too is a descendant of Abraham. For the Son of Man has come to seek and to save what was lost."

Small Group Faith Sharing Questions

- 1) What do you think Jesus was doing by spending time with Zacchaeus?
- 2) What in your life helps you to see Jesus clearly?
- 3) What generally is wealth and its right use?
- 4) How would you answer the question: Do I use money in a way acceptable to Jesus? If not always, what needs to change?
- If Jesus confronted you today, and you needed to make amends for your past "love of money", personally, what would you do?
- 6) How do you think Zacchaeus felt after spending time with Jesus?

BRUSH UP YOUR SACRAMENTS!

There's an old Cole Porter song called "Brush Up Your Shakespeare." For us, it's important every now and then to brush up on what we believe as well as how we pray and worship as Catholic Christians. Once a month our priests will take an extra minute or two at Sunday

Mass to explain a part of our Liturgy. Last week we learned about Gathering and the Greeting. Next month we will explore the Penitential Rite.

In the meantime, Fr. Rich will give a one hour presentation on what we believe about the Sacraments. This is important because the Sacraments are so essential to our Catholic life. Fr. Rich will review what a Sacrament is, how they help us experience God's presence and love, and how they help us live better lives as disciples of Jesus Christ. Everyone is invited. 31st SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME GO FIND A SYCAMORE

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

Have you climbed any trees lately? I certainly haven't but I can remember the days when I did. Growing up we had a tree in our backyard that was perfect for climbing and also for building. There, nestled between its strong branches, we built a tree *fort* ... that's what we called it and that's what it was. It was definitely not a tree *house*. Like other forts, this one was used as a defense against the demands and responsibilities of the real world below. In the fort we could hide and dream and read and play (often for hours at a time). We could escape from homework and mowing the lawn or setting the table. We could be kids.

Our Gospel today has a tree and a man in the tree. Zacchaeus is a grown up, an adult. He has a job and adult responsibilities. He has a nice house. He collects taxes for a living (making him not the most popular guy on the block).

When Jesus comes to town, Zacchaeus, like everyone else, wants to see him. He is on the short side. So he climbs a tree. (When the Pope came to Philly I remember seeing people in the trees and they reminded me of this story).

Zacchaeus climbs a tree. Probably something he hadn't done since when he was a kid playing in the backyard. He sees Jesus. Jesus sees him. And that encounter changes his life forever. It brings conversion, a new way of living.

Didn't Jesus once say you had to become like a little child to enter the Kingdom of God?


