GOSPEL MATTHEW 4:12-17

When Jesus heard that John had been arrested, he withdrew to Galilee. He left Nazareth and went to live in Capernaum by the sea, in the region of Zebulun and Naphtali, that what had been said through Isaiah the prophet might be fulfilled:

Land of Zebulun and land of Naphtali, the way to the sea, beyond the Jordan, Galilee of the Gentiles, the people who sit in darkness have seen a great light, on those dwelling in a land overshadowed by death light has arisen.

From that time on, Jesus began to preach and say, "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand."

As he was walking by the Sea of Galilee, he saw two brothers, Simon who is called Peter, and his brother Andrew, casting a net into the sea; they were fishermen. He said to them, "Come after me, and I will make you fishers of men." At once they left their nets and followed him.

He walked along from there and saw two other brothers, James, the son of Zebedee, and his brother John. They were in a boat, with their father Zebedee, mending their nets.

He called them, and immediately they left their boat and their father and followed him.

He went around all of Galilee, teaching in their synagogues, proclaiming the gospel of the kingdom, and curing every disease and illness among the people.

SOMETHING HAPPENS

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

Jesus preached. His first homily was short and to the point: "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand."

Jesus invited: "Come after me." "Follow me."

Jesus taught in synagogues where people prayed. He proclaimed the gospel along the seashore where people worked.

Everywhere Jesus went, everywhere He preached and proclaimed the Good News (that's what "gospel" means), something happened. People stopped to listen. People followed. People were healed. Lives were changed. Those lost in darkness, found light and hope. The sick were cured. Enemies were reconciled.

Jesus is God's Word in the flesh.

God's Word is powerful. God's Word heals and empowers, challenges and uplifts. That Word is still active today. Jesus speaks to us when we read the Word of God found in the Scriptures, the Bible. It is important to read it privately at home in our prayer, to study it. But it is also vitally important to listen to the Word proclaimed at Mass. When we hear the Scriptures, it is Jesus speaking.

Pope Francis has named today **SUNDAY OF THE WORD OF GOD**. Everyone of us should ask ourselves: what is our relationship with the Word of God? May our answer be honest. Then, may all of us be not simply Hearers of God's Word but also Doers of it. But ... we cannot believe, we cannot do, we cannot put into action what we have not heard. Hearing comes first. Let's not fool ourselves. One Sunday of the Word of God is not enough. We must make 2020 a **YEAR** of GOD'S WORD.

When we hear God's Word, something happens.

Do you ever wonder if you are making the right decisions? While recovering from a serious injury in battle, St. Ignatius Loyola, the founder of the Society of Jesus (the Jesuits), learned to distinguish what thoughts and desires came from God and what did not. The evening will examine what Discernment is from a spiritual perspective, how to recognize your desires and push back against movements that are not of God, and ways that you can use to make good choices both in major decisions and everyday life.

CARITAS ENLIGHTENMENTS

Use People First Language

When writing or speaking about a person who happens to have a disability, words should be chosen with care in order to promote dignity and respect. We can use "People First Language" to support an inclusive environment in our parish:

- Refer to the person first. Say "a man who uses a wheelchair."
- •If the disability isn't important to the story or conversation, don't mention it.
- Describe a person, not a condition. Say "a person with epilepsy."
- Never use the term "mentally retarded." The acceptable terms are "intellectual disability" or "cognitive disability."
- Avoid use of the word "handicapped." Say "accessible parking."
- Emphasize abilities, not limitations. Say "walks with crutches,"
 "uses a hearing aid," "uses augmentative or alternative communication," or "uses a wheelchair."
- Don't use generic labels such as "the disabled" for groups of people with disabilities.
- Don't refer to people with disabilities as patients. A disability is not a disease.
- •Speak of people with disabilities as the active participants in society that they are.

Remember, too: Those who are over the age of 60, and anyone with a health issue, are *not required* to fast one hour before receiving Holy Communion. *Thank you!*
