GOSPEL JOHN 4:5-15, 19b-26, 39a, 40-42

Jesus came to a town of Samaria called Sychar, near the plot of land that Jacob had given to his son Joseph. Jacob's well was there. Jesus, tired from his journey, sat down there at the well. It was about noon.

A woman of Samaria came to draw water. Jesus said to her, "Give me a drink." His disciples had gone into the town to buy food. The Samaritan woman said to him, "How can you, a Jew, ask me, a Samaritan woman, for a drink?" —For Jews use nothing in common with Samaritans.— Jesus answered and said to her, "If you knew the gift of God and who is saying to you, 'Give me a drink, 'you would have asked him and he would have given you living water." The woman said to him, "Sir, you do not even have a bucket and the cistern is deep; where then can you get this living water? Are you greater than our father Jacob, who gave us this cistern and drank from it himself with his children and his flocks?" Jesus answered and said to her, "Everyone who drinks this water will be thirsty again; but whoever drinks the water I shall give will never thirst; the water I shall give will become in him a spring of water welling up to eternal life." The woman said to him, "Sir, give me this water, so that I may not be thirsty or have to keep coming here to draw water.

"I can see that you are a prophet. Our ancestors worshiped on this mountain; but you people say that the place to worship is in Jerusalem." Jesus said to her, "Believe me, woman, the hour is coming when you will worship the Father neither on this mountain nor in Jerusalem. You people worship what you do not understand; we worship what we understand, because salvation is from the Jews. But the hour is coming, and is now here, when true worshipers will worship the Father in Spirit and truth; and indeed the Father seeks such people to worship him. God is Spirit, and those who worship him must worship in Spirit and truth." The woman said to him, "I know that the Messiah is coming, the one called the Christ; when he comes, he will tell us everything." Jesus said to her, "I am he, the one who is speaking with you."

Many of the Samaritans of that town began to believe in him. When the Samaritans came to him, they invited him to stay with them; and he stayed there two days. Many more began to believe in him because of his word, and they said to the woman, "We no longer believe because of your word; for we have heard for ourselves, and we know that this is truly the savior of the world."

WHO IS LIVING WATER

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

Jesus meets a woman at a well. She's had some relationship challenges; who hasn't, right? Like the rest of us, at the end of the day she wants to be loved. She wants to be recognized for who she is, as she is. That's exactly what Jesus gives her. He knows her. He recognizes her. And in this exchange by the well, she comes to know Him in a deeper way.

These are difficult times to say the least. We are all a little frightened. We all have our challenges and "issues," big and small, relational and otherwise. We have our own worries and we have to deal with the threat of illness. In it all, let's remember and recognize who we are. We are all human beings. We are all like that Samaritan woman at the well. And just as Jesus knew her, Jesus knows us. Jesus knows our fears and failures. He knows our hurts and hopes. He knows what we want most from life and He knows what gets in the way.

For the woman at the well, Jesus was living water ... water that refreshes the soul, the deepest thirsts in our lives. As we meet Jesus today in the Eucharist, let Him be that living water for you. Let Christ's presence encourage and strengthen you. Let Christ's love and mercy give you hope.

After meeting Jesus, the woman at the well walked back to town a new person. She became a source of faith and encouragement to others. She became living water.

Our water fonts at the doors of the church may be empty today; **but the well is not!** The well is the heart of Jesus! Let Jesus fill you up today and send you out to be living water for all you meet! Living water brings life and joy and peace! We can be that that living water for each other and for the world!

Registration Starting April 1st

Our mission is to help parents share the Catholic faith with their children through several methods of learning. We hope to bring these young people to a deeper relationship with God from the teachings and love of Jesus Christ through the Holy Spirit. Methods of learning:

- Traditional classroom: On Monday or Tuesday afternoons for Grades 1-5 and Monday or Tuesday evenings for Grades 6,7, and 8. This program runs from September until May.
- •<u>Home Study Grades 3,4,5 and 6.</u> This is for parents who cannot bring their child to the Monday or Tuesday classroom settings. The parent would teach the child at home one lesson per week. We also ask that your child attend three activities throughout the school year.
- Family Catechesis: This program is offered to 1st and 2nd grade parents only. As a parent you will teach your child at home for three weeks with curriculum provided and then attend a class once a month in the evening with your child to reinforce what was taught at home. Both parent and child must attend this once a month class. Dates for once a month classes will be announced in July.
- Special Disciples This is a classroom setting for those with special needs. Our catechists are certified to teach children with special needs and we have a one on one approach with the children. This program runs every other Sunday during the 9am Mass from October until April.

Advisory Amid Coronavirus Concerns

- 2. Priests, deacons & extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion should practice good hygiene, washing hands with soap and water or anti-bacterial hand sanitizer, before and after distributing Holy Communion;

- 4. The practice of distributing the Precious Blood from the Chalice is suspended;
