As they were coming down from the mountain, Jesus charged them,

"Do not tell the vision to anyone until the Son of Man has been raised from the dead."

REVEALING GOD

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

I've said this before so pretend you haven't heard it: I love the Abraham stories in Genesis and I think our times have a lot in common with his times ... even though he lived some 3500 years ago.

This Sunday we get a tiny four and a half verses glimpse into Abraham's early life; so early, he's only Abram (the third syllable to his name will come later). In today's passage (Genesis 12:1-4a), we hear God telling Abram to gather up his kinfolk, pack up and leave his homeland. God will give him a new land that will become a great nation. Abram does what God has told him even if he isn't exactly sure who this God is.

One thing immediately stands out: God speaks. God interacts with Abraham. This is not a distant, remote, uncaring God. This God speaks. As the Abraham story unfolds, we will hear conversations between God and Abraham, as the latter tries to figure out who this God is and what exactly God wants. Abraham has to discern what makes this God different from all the other gods worshipped by people around him.

That's the part I think is so similar to our day. So many people today no longer have a good "grip" on the God presented in the Bible. There are all sorts of ideas floating around (literally floating ... on internet clouds and in tweets and emails, etc.). Just like Abraham had to learn about God, so many people today have to learn as well.

Here's a good place to start when talking to people about the God of the Bible: this God reveals Himself. This God wants to be known. This God wants to know us. This God enters into a dialogue with us. This God cares about us and all of humanity.

How do we know this? Because of Jesus. As St. Paul tells us today in Second Timothy: Christ Jesus is God "made manifest." How wonderful that God opens Himself up to us and enters fully into our world.

This week, we can take Jesus with us wherever we go and we can also allow Jesus *to take us*, as He did with Peter, James and John, in prayer perhaps, up a "mountain" where we will meet Him in a new way.

Advisory Amid Coronavirus Concerns

In light of the escalating concern about the spread of the coronavirus (COVID_19) Bishop David M. O'Connell has issued the following instructions on liturgical practices effective immediately:

1. People who have flu-like symptoms or who are otherwise feeling sick should not go to Mass or other Church gatherings;
2. Priests, deacons & extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion should practice good hygiene, washing hands with soap and water or anti-bacterial hand sanitizer, before and after distributing Holy Communion;
3. People are encouraged not to receive communion on the tongue; reception by hand is preferred until otherwise notified;
4. The practice of distributing the Precious Blood from the Chalice is suspended;
5. The practice of exchanging the sign of peace by any physical contact (handshake, embrace, kissing) is suspended.

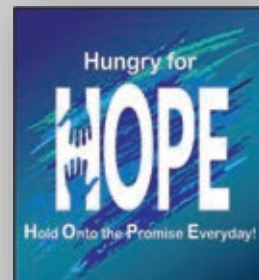
