He said to him,

"You shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind. This is the greatest and the first commandment.

The second is like it:

You shall love your neighbor as yourself.

The whole law and the prophets depend on these two commandments."

LOVE AMONG THE RUINED



Dear Parishioners and Friends,

This may come as a surprise to some, but no one was surprised by Jesus' response to the question, "Teacher, which commandment in the law is the greatest?" Jesus' response — "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, all your soul, and with all your mind is the greatest and the first commandment" can easily be found in the Torah, what we call the Old Testament. Every Jew, and certainly every Pharisee, knew this. No surprise here. Jesus isn't adding anything new.

Likewise, even when Jesus expanded on his response and spoke of a second commandment — "You shall love your neighbor as yourself" — this would not have been a surprise. Again, Jesus, very knowledgeable of the Scriptures, is quoting the Torah, the Word of God.

The whole law and the prophets "depend on these two commandments," Jesus says.

We can easily agree. We can all also easily agree that putting these commandments into practice is challenging. Loving God with everything we are and have is difficult, as is loving our neighbor *and* even sometimes loving ourselves.

The Pharisees are trying to trip up Jesus and once again he outsmarts them. But Jesus wants to do more than play intellectual, verbal volleyball. He wants to bring people into a deeper relationship with God and, therefore, also with others. He wants to show that faith in the One God is not simply a matter of following the law or memorizing commandments.

Some people think these two laws also sum up Jesus' life and consequently Christianity. Loving God and loving neighbor as yourself. But if we stop with this, we are not allowing Jesus to bring us into that deeper relationship that can only come with faith in Christ Jesus as Lord.

If I think these two commandments sum up the Christian life, sum up how a disciple of Jesus should live, then I am not taking the extra step with Him. My Gospel reading might as well stop right here in Chapter 22 of Matthew. I don't go to the Upper Room, I don't sit at the table at the Last Supper, I don't go into the Garden of Gethsemane, I don't go to the Cross or the Empty Tomb. And, I am not there when the Spirit comes.

Jesus did not come just to repeat what was already written. He comes to fulfill the law and the prophets ... and in doing this, Jesus gives us something new. Yes. A new law. A new commandment. But you only hear of this new commandment if you are willing to go to the Cross, and the only way to live this new commandment is with the help of the Holy Spirit.

"Love one another as I love you."

Love the way Jesus loves. That is *our* commandment.

NEW GROUP FORMING FOR THOSE INTERESTED IN BECOMING CATHOLIC OR COMPLETING THEIR SACRAMENTS

The journey of faith is the most important journey we take as human beings. The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) is a process for those who have not been baptized or have been baptized in another Christian denomination and wish to follow Jesus Christ in the Roman Catholic tradition. 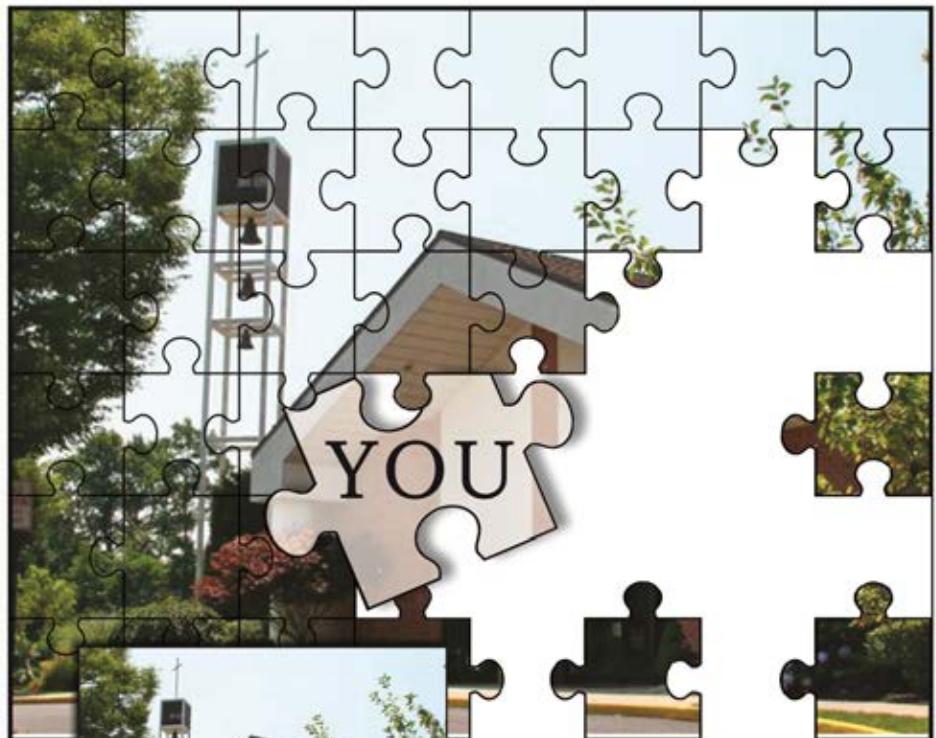
