WHAT TO EXPECT AT MASS:

- **Everyone is invited to return to Mass!!** There is no room capacity limit. All pews (but two) are now open. Pre-registration is not required.
- **Those who are ill** are not required to come to Mass. (In fact, as we have learned, it is an act of kindness and sacrifice to keep others healthy by remaining home. Thank you!)
- We will continue to **sanitize** the church every day.
- Sanitizing stations will be at every entrance. We ask you to **sanitize your hands** upon entering and exiting the church building.
- **Masks** are optional for those who are fully vaccinated. No one will be judged for wearing a mask.
- The **Mass Schedule** remains the same (no Noon Mass yet ... thanks for your patience!).
- Every Mass will be **simulcast in Pedata Hall** for those who might be more comfortable there.
- The 10:30am Mass will continue to be **livestreamed** for those not able to come to church.
- The return of the opening and closing processions, more music and the "regular" Communion lines.
- **Ministers of Communion** must wear a mask while distributing the Sacrament.
- We will continue to share the **Sign of Peace** as we have been doing.
- During the summer months, **altar servers** who wish to volunteer and serve may do so at their own choosing. Please see the priest before Mass begins. Scheduling of altar servers will begin in September.
- For the time being, **collection boxes** will continue to be used for your weekly offering.
- **Votive candles** may be lit; **poor boxes** may be used, and **Holy water fonts** will be wet again!

- I urge Representative Kim to protect the Hyde Amendment and to oppose any bill, including appropriation bills, that expand taxpayer funding of abortion.

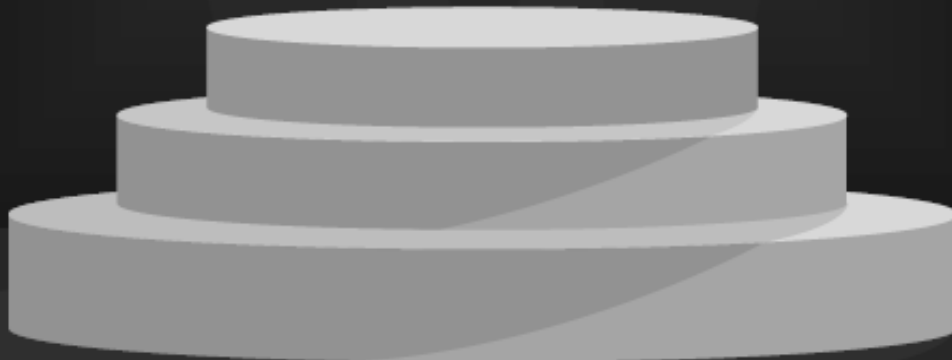
