

# GOSPEL MARK 9: 38-43, 45, 47-48

At that time, John said to Jesus, "Teacher, we saw someone driving out demons in your name, and we tried to prevent him because he does not follow us." Jesus replied, "Do not prevent him. There is no one who performs a mighty deed in my name who can at the same time speak ill of me. For whoever is not against us is for us. Anyone who gives you a cup of water to drink because you belong to Christ, amen, I say to you, will surely not lose his reward. "Whoever causes one of these little ones who believe in me to sin, it would be better for him if a great millstone were put around his neck and he were thrown into the sea. If your hand causes you to sin, cut it off. It is better for you to enter into life maimed than with two hands to go into Gehenna, into the unquenchable fire. And if your foot causes you to sin, cut if off. It is better for you to enter into life crippled than with two feet to be thrown into Gehenna. And if your eye causes you to sin, pluck it out. Better for you to enter into the kingdom of God with one eye than with two eyes to be thrown into Gehenna, where 'their worm does not die, and the fire is not quenched."

### THE SPIRIT IS A MOVIN'

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

One of the first "guitar Masses" I attended (that I can remember) was in the early Seventies at St. Thomas More in Cherry Hill (before the current church was built!). The cantor/guitarist was a young woman (I wish I knew her name). She sang beautifully, so strong and with such feeling! She sang, "The Spirit is a movin' all over, all over this land!" (Carey Landry, the composer of the song, also wrote *Hail Mary, Gentle Woman*).

I felt something move within me that Sunday.
Guess what it was? Yup! You guessed it. **THE SPIRIT!**(I know a lot of people today like to put down the
Seventies, saying it was a time of terrible catechesis, felt
banners, and trite music. Many of the people who make
these critiques were not even alive then. For the record:
My faith was awakened, deepened, strengthened and
broadened in that decade. Spiritually, I came alive and I
know a lot of other people can say the same thing.)

The Holy Spirit MOVES! There is no stopping the Holy Spirit! The Holy Spirit has ALWAYS been moving and is moving TODAY. The Spirit moves people, wakes us up, stirs us in action to serve the Kingdom of God (which is always bigger than we can imagine!). The Spirit leads and inspires us to greater, deeper, compassionate, inclusive, unitive love. Our Scriptures today point this out. The Spirit never puts down, divides or derides. The Spirit is never arrogant or self-serving. And our tendency to do these negative things will not and never stop the Spirit from moving.

How is the Spirit moving in your life? How is the Spirit awakening, strengthening, broadening your faith? How is the Spirit leading, calling, inspiring you to greater involvement in the work of Jesus Christ? How is the Spirit making you new? This is what the Holy Spirit always does!

The Spirit is indeed a movin'- Me, and you, too! Fr. Rich

# **RELIGIOUS EDUCATION**

We are excited for the 2021-2022 Religious Education year to start! We are looking for catechists and aides who would like to teach 7<sup>th</sup> or 8<sup>th</sup> grade in person, and catechists who would like to teach virtually in grades 3<sup>rd</sup> through 6<sup>th</sup>!

- In-Person Teaching Due to current circumstances, we are offering in-person classes every other week for grades 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup>, beginning October 4<sup>th</sup>/5<sup>th</sup>. Catechists will give students assignments to complete on the weeks they are not in the classroom. 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> grades are the years when we prepare our children for the Sacrament of Confirmation, so these are particularly vital (and fun!) years to teach.
- Virtual Teaching If you are looking for a volunteer opportunity that has some flexibility built into it, teaching virtually might be a great fit since you can do everything from the comfort of your own home! Catechists will meet virtually for 15-30 minutes each week on a Monday or Tuesday for grades 3<sup>rd</sup> 6<sup>th</sup> beginning in October, and will use the Google Classroom platform to post resources and assignments for their students. A class on how to use Google Classroom is being provided here at St. Joan's it's easier than you think!
