Dear Parishioners and Friends,

Like all of you, I have been horrified watching and reading about the devastation being wreaked upon the nation and people of Ukraine. Just when we hope as a human race we have learned the lessons of the past, about the senselessness and inhumanity of war, we find ourselves faced with it again. My heart breaks for the people there, as does yours, I am sure.

The madness of this latest atrocity reminds us once again of our common humanity. We are all indeed one and when someone, somewhere, is hurt, we all hurt. It has been inspiring to see so many people in the nations bordering on Ukraine helping the thousands upon thousands of refugees who have left behind everything — including loved ones. People all across the globe have been reaching out to help in any way we can. Many of you have made donations to Catholic Relief Services.

As I watch and pray I am also taught a lesson. How petty I can be when I complain of some discomfort. I do not wish to make light of anyone's difficulties — God knows with seven funerals this past week there are many people in our town who are grieving — but does it not put things in perspective when we see people's homes and towns in Ukraine blown to bits? Does it not put things in perspective when we see families torn apart, saying farewell to a father, a brother, a husband not knowing when or if they will see him ever again? God chastens me to see a bigger picture and to not let my own molehills become a mountain range.

The bigger picture is what Jesus gives us today in our Gospel as we hear of the Lord's Transfiguration. Along with the disciples, we get a glimpse of the Glorified Christ, the Risen Jesus, the One who was and is and always will be with the Father. This glimpse into the truest identity of Jesus Christ gives us also a glimpse into our identity and our destiny. Easter will come. Nothing will stop God's plan of salvation and love. Hatred and war and division will not have the final say. God's Word is final and everlasting. In dark times, we must always look to the Light that is ever within us.



- "Synod" (pronounced *sin-odd*) comes from a Greek word that means "to journey together." While we make private and personal "resolutions" during Lent, it is also a time to pray, sacrifice and give alms (do good) *together*.
- So: Less sin ... More Synod. This is what discipleship calls us to during the 40 days of Lent and indeed all throughout the year. Let's try it at home, at work and play, at Church, wherever and whenever.


