OVER TWO HUNDRED AND FIFTY TIMES

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

Yup, that's right. In the New Testament you will find the word 'disciple' over 250 times. Interestingly, the word 'Christian' shows up only three times. To be a disciple means to follow and to learn and then to be sent out. We see a little bit of this going on in today's passage from the Gospel of Luke. We are in a section of Luke's Gospel where Jesus is "resolutely" journeying toward Jerusalem and as he does he continues to call people to follow him, as he also sends his disciples out to prepare the way. All of this not without opposition.

Our Gospel this week and in the weeks to come reminds us that Christians — you and me — are disciples of Jesus Christ. We may not use the word often but it is what we are. And as disciples of Christ, we are invited everyday to make a choice to follow Him. It is not an easy choice. It demands a radical commitment. Jesus challenges us to leave behind an old way of living and to learn a new Way, putting the values of His kingdom first in our hearts. We are also sent everyday to bring these values with us into every situation, every conversation, every relationship. As Jesus encountered opposition, so will we. And, like Jesus, our destination is Jerusalem. Not a geographical dot on a map, but the Heavenly Jerusalem.

Might be a good idea to include the word 'disciple' in our prayers this week. Help me, Lord, to be a faithful, joyful, committed disciple today. Maybe if we used the word more in our prayer, in our thinking and conversations, like 250 times a week, we would grow in our awareness of the privilege and responsibilities that come with this special relationship with Jesus, our Teacher, our Savior.

THE ECCLESIAL EUCHARIST

THE FIRST IN A WEEKLY SERIES ON THE EUCHARIST

In one of his many sermons, Augustine wrote of the Eucharist, “For what you see is simply bread and a cup - this is the information your eyes report. But your faith demands far subtler insight: the bread is Christ's body, the cup is Christ's blood.” Christ gave His own body and blood in this most Blessed Sacrament, a miraculous sign of God’s incomprehensible love for us. For this we give thanks, and hence we call this sacrament Eucharist, which in Greek means just that: thanksgiving. But notice also we call this sacrament Communion. What is it for one to be in communion? We say that to commune with another is to share in a way that brings intimacy. To be in communion with someone is to be in a state of oneness with them, a state of unity. Indeed, the origin of the word comes from the Latin meaning “with unity”. So surely, we give thanks for Holy Communion, but how does unity relate to this sacrament?

We must remember that this sacrament is indeed the body of Christ. But then we may ask, what is the body of Christ? Augustine reminds us that we are the body of Christ, writing: “So now, if you want to understand the body of Christ, listen to the Apostle Paul speaking to the faithful: ‘You are the body of Christ, member for member.’ If you, therefore, are Christ's body and members, it is your own mystery that is placed on the Lord's table! It is your own mystery that you are receiving! You are saying "Amen" to what you are.” Thus, there is an ecclesial element to the Eucharist. That is, the Eucharistic mystery of Christ’s fleshly body can reveal to us insight into the mystery of the mystical body of Christ, the Church. St. Paul tells us in First Corinthians, “The bread is one, and we, though many, are one body.” So, this sacrament reveals to us the unity of the Church. There is after all only one body of Christ, the Church, which is a unity of all its members. Drawing out the imagery of the sacrament, Augustine identifies the individual members of the Church with one of the many grains that are used to make the one bread. So, in this sacrament, we see the unity, that is the communion, of all the members of the Church gathered together as one body in Christ, just as there is one Eucharistic bread made of many grains.

But of course, this is not merely theoretical, but practical as well. Life teaches us very quickly that unity is not easy. Indeed, how often do we see St. Paul exhorting even the earliest Christians to act as though they were one in Christ. No doubt we too fail often in this respect, living as though we remained that single grain alone, unconnected from the one bread we ought to be a part of. Augustine reminds us that a grain of wheat does not sprout out of the soil as a loaf, but instead must be transformed into one. First, he says the grain must be ground. That is, we must purify ourselves, relinquishing the sins we attach ourselves to and which will inevitably lead to division. Next, the dough produced by the grinding must be leavened. Augustine identifies this with baptism, as that is the sacrament which incorporates us into the Church. But of course, we by our own efforts cannot reach the unity which Christian perfection calls for. Our wills must be strengthened and vivified by grace, granted to us through the Baptism, but also the other sacraments as well, including the Eucharist. Indeed, to be that one body, we must continue to live, by grace, the way which is Christ, a path which we are guided on by the promptings of the spirit. Thus, Augustine says that we were baked when we received the Holy Spirit. So, let us strive to be the one body of Christ, the Church, as we receive his one body in the Eucharist by detaching ourselves from sin, relying on the grace of the sacraments, and be attentive to the lead of the Spirit.

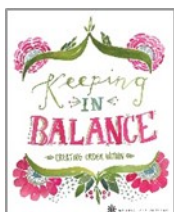

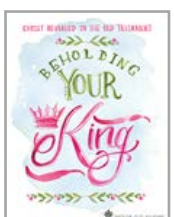

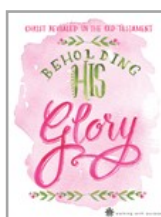
