

GOSPEL LUKE 10: 25-37

There was a scholar of the law who stood up to test Jesus and said, "Teacher, what must I do to inherit eternal life?" Jesus said to him, "What is written in the law? How do you read it?" He said in reply, "You shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your being, with all your strength, and with all your mind, and your neighbor as yourself." He replied to him, "You have answered correctly; do this and you will live." But because he wished to justify himself, he said to Jesus, "And who is my neighbor?" Jesus replied, "A man fell victim to robbers as he went down from Jerusalem to Jericho. They stripped and beat him and went off leaving him half-dead. A priest happened to be going down that road, but when he saw him, he passed by on the opposite side.

Likewise a Levite came to the place, and when he saw him, he passed by on the opposite side. But a Samaritan traveler who came upon him was moved with compassion at the sight. He approached the victim, poured oil and wine over his wounds and bandaged them. Then he lifted him up on his own animal, took him to an inn, and cared for him. The next day he took out two silver coins and gave them to the innkeeper with the instruction, 'Take care of him. If you spend more than what I have given you, I shall repay you on my way back.' Which of these three, in your opinion, was neighbor to the robbers' victim?" He answered, "The one who treated him with mercy." Jesus said to him, "Go and do likewise."

THE REAL PRESCENCE: SCRIPTURE & TRADITION THE THIRD IN A WEEKLY SERIES ON THE EUCHARIST

Perhaps the most distinctive feature of the Catholic doctrine of the Eucharist is the belief in the real presence. Once the priest says the words of consecration over the gifts of bread and wine, they truly do become the body, blood, soul, and divinity of our Lord. Hence the name real presence, as Jesus is really there. Indeed, the *whole* of the substance of bread and wine is transformed into Christ. Nothing of the bread and wine remain except the mere *appearance*, and as such, the bread and wine are no longer really there. So, we might say that we not only believe in the real presence of Jesus, but also in the real absence of bread and wine in the Eucharist. The Blessed Sacrament is truly, completely, and wholly Jesus Christ.

Yet, as mentioned at the beginning, this is a Catholic belief, a view not shared by many Christians. Why do we believe in this doctrine? Of course, we believe because it was revealed to us by Jesus Christ, as made clear in the bible. Nowhere is this more apparent than in the Gospel of John. Christ says "I am the bread of life... Truly, truly, I say to you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of man and drink his blood, you have no life in you; he who eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise him up at the last day. For my flesh is food indeed, and my blood is drink indeed. He who eats my flesh and drinks my blood abides in me, and I in him. Because we, in faith, accept all that Jesus reveals to us to be true, we accept even the most incredible and miraculous claims he makes to us. One such claim is made right here in scripture: that, despite all appearances, Christ truly gives his flesh and blood as food and drink, which is the Eucharist.

Our view of real presence is confirmed not only by testimony of scripture, but also tradition. The teaching of the real presence was not theological innovation made centuries after the coming of Christ. Rather, even the earliest Christians believed in the Catholic doctrine of real presence. We have extant writings of Christians dating to the second century, only a couple generations removed from Jesus himself. These were people who in some instances were formed by the apostles themselves; that is, they were people who knew those who knew Christ directly, and these Christians too professed the real presence of Christ in the Eucharist. One of the most famous examples is the early bishop St. Ignatius of Antioch who died in 117 A.D. Formed by the Apostle John, St. Ignatius writes of the Eucharist, "Take note of those who hold heterodox opinions on the grace of Jesus Christ which has come to us, and see how contrary their opinions are to the mind of God. . . . They abstain from the Eucharist and from prayer because they do not confess that the Eucharist is the flesh of our Savior Jesus Christ, flesh which suffered for our sins and which that Father, in his goodness, raised up again." Those who rejected the real presence, even from the earliest time, were said to reject the teachings of God. This, according to a man who was taught the faith by the beloved disciple himself, and who was martyred only around 80 years after Jesus. Aside from scripture, what could be more trustworthy testimony of the teachings of Jesus Christ then those so close to Jesus? Perhaps the testimony of the Apostles, but their testimony is Scripture! It was John, the teacher of St. Ignatius, whose gospel was quoted above. Thus, with the confidence of scripture and tradition, we should have no doubt that, during the consecration of the Mass, the bread and wine remain no longer, but are instead transformed truly into our Lord Jesus Christ.
