

GOSPEL LUKE 10:38-42

Jesus entered a village where a woman whose name was Martha welcomed him. She had a sister named Mary who sat beside the Lord at his feet listening to him speak. Martha, burdened with much serving, came to him and said, "Lord, do you not care that my sister has left me by myself to do the serving? Tell her to help me." The Lord said to her in reply, "Martha, Martha, you are anxious and worried about many things. There is need of only one thing. Mary has chosen the better part and it will not be taken from her."

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

Perhaps you have seen the famous painting of Jesus knocking on the door. It is based on a verse in the Book of Revelation (3:20): "Behold, I stand at the door, and knock: if anyone hear My voice, and open the door, I will come in to him, and will sup with him, and he with Me." It turns out, Jesus did a lot of "knocking" and "supping" during his ministry.

Today's Gospel from Luke has Jesus visiting the home two dear friends, Martha and Mary. We are told in other places throughout the Gospel that Jesus enters the homes of His friends and followers, Pharisees and even tax collectors. Remember Zacchaeus, the little man in the tree? Jesus sees him and tells him to come down. "I must stay at your house."

These holy house calls are present all throughout the Scriptures. Right from the start, according to Genesis, God takes a stroll in the Garden of Eden in the cool of the evening. In our first reading today, also from Genesis, we hear of perhaps the most infamous of divine visits in the Old Testament. Abraham welcomes and entertains three guests who suddenly appear as if from nowhere and announce that in a year his wife, Sarah, will have a child.

When the people in the Gospels witness Jesus healing someone, they shout out, "God has visited His people." Perhaps we are really saying the very same thing, God has visited His people, when today we call something a "God-Wink," or say, "It was no coincidence" or claim something to be an answer to prayer. Of course, as Catholics, we truly believe the Lord Jesus Christ is present when two or more gather in His name, when we gather together, when we share His Word, when we celebrate the Eucharist. It is no joke. Jesus Christ is truly knocking on the door of our hearts. Interestingly, though, Christ knocks from the inside ... because God is Always With Us. That is what the Incarnation, the Word-Made-Flesh, the Son of God truly teaches us.

THE SACRIFICIAL ELEMENT OF THE EUCHARIST THE FOURTH IN A WEEKLY SERIES ON THE EUCHARIST

So far in this series we have talked about the Eucharist's ecclesial dimension, its sacramentality, and the real presence as attested to by both scripture and tradition. Now we will discuss one of the Blessed Sacrament's most important aspects: the sacrificial element of the Eucharist. We do, after all, refer to the celebration of the Eucharist as "The holy sacrifice of the Mass." So, how is the Eucharist a sacrifice, and why is this so important?

Starting with the latter question, we must recall what is perhaps the central tenet of our Christian faith: that through the paschal mystery, Christ has redeemed the world. That is, man, who was once dead on account of his sin, was saved through the sacrifice which Christ made on the cross to the Father. In giving himself up to death, Jesus sanctified man, and opened to him eternal life. Thus, the sacrifice of Christ is the culmination of all salvation history, the long path of events which God arranged in His providence so that we all might be saved. Indeed, the cross was to be one, eternal sacrifice, for the forgiveness of all sins. As the letter of the Hebrews states, "By one sacrifice he has made perfect forever those who are being made holy." Thus, the importance of this sacrifice is made clear: it is on this one sacrifice that all our hopes rest upon; it is through this one sacrifice that we are offered God's saving grace.

Yet, this raises another question: if all rests on the one sacrifice of Christ on the cross, what is the point of the Mass, and how can the mass be a sacrifice? Are we preforming additional sacrifices over and over again? Certainly not! Christ's one sacrifice was complete and sufficient. Rather, when the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ are offered on the altar, we are entering into one and the same sacrifice made by Jesus all those years ago on Calvary. The theologian James O'Connor writes of this mystery, "When Christ becomes present at Mass he does so not in order to repeat the sacrifice of the Cross but to draw us into it, to make us participants in his one sacrifice... The Last Supper and Calvary and the Mass are all the same sacrifice, not because the historical acts of the past are repeated or re-presented but because of the intrinsic unity that all these actions, past and present, possess in the one Priest and Victim." Thus, the Mass makes present to us the very sacrifice of the cross by making present Jesus, in whom the actions of the Mass and cross are unified. By receiving the Eucharist, we come in direct contact with Jesus, and thus that very sacrifice where he himself was the victim. As O'Connor says, by taking part in the Mass we are made "participants" in this sacrifice, and thus the true grandeur of our sacred liturgy is made manifest. By the Mass, we are able to approach, indeed be a part of, that apex of salvation history whose importance is impossible to understate. By the Mass we participate in the very redemption of the world. So, as we come to God's holy table, let us remember and reflect on the gift and privilege the Mass is. It is by the sacrifice that is the Mass, the very sacrifice of Calvary, that we are saved, and it is the Mass that lets us become a part of that act of salvation.


