

GOSPEL LUKE 10: 1-2, 17-20

At that time the Lord appointed seventy -two others whom he sent ahead of him in pairs to every town and place he intended to visit. He said to them, "The harvest is abundant but the laborers are few; so ask the master of the harvest to send out laborers for his harvest. Go on your way; behold, I am sending you like lambs among wolves. Carry no money bag, no sack, no sandals; and greet no one along the way. Into whatever house you enter, first say, 'Peace to this household.' If a peaceful person lives there, your peace will rest on him; but if not, it will return to you. Stay in the same house and eat and drink what is offered to you, for the laborer deserves his payment. Do not move about from one house to another. Whatever town you enter and they welcome you, eat what is set before you, cure the sick in it and say to them, 'The kingdom of God is at hand for you.' Whatever town you enter and they do not receive you, go out into the streets and say, 'The dust of your town that clings to our feet, even that we shake off against you.' Yet know this: the kingdom of God is at hand. I tell you, it will be more tolerable for Sodom on that day than for that town." The seventy-two returned rejoicing, and said, "Lord, even the demons are subject to us because of your name." Jesus said, "I have observed Satan fall like lightning from the sky. Behold, I have given you the power to 'tread upon serpents' and scorpions and upon the full force of the enemy and nothing will harm you. Nevertheless, do not rejoice because the spirits are subject to you, but rejoice because your names are written in heaven."

THE EUCHARIST AND SACRAMENTALITY THE SECOND IN A WEEKLY SERIES ON THE EUCHARIST

It is no coincidence that we call the Eucharist the Blessed Sacrament, as it, of all the seven which Christ instituted, is the principal sacrament, the greatest of all. This becomes clear once we understand the essence of sacramentality itself. The Catechism calls the sacraments "efficacious signs of grace, instituted by Christ and entrusted to the Church, by which divine life is dispensed to us." Breaking this down a bit, let us first ask what is meant by signs. In the sacraments, the sign is the outward element, or matter and form of the sacrament. So, for example, in baptism the sign is composed of the running water (matter) and the words (form), "I baptize you in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit." In the Eucharist, the outward sign consists of the matter, bread and wine, and the form, which is the prayer during the consecration.

But what is signified by visible form and matter of the sacraments? The visible sacraments are signs of invisible grace. However, recalling the definition from the catechism, they are not only signs but efficacious signs of that grace. That is, they are not signs which merely point to grace, but they actually make the reality of grace present. Consider the difference between the word "Eucharist" and the Eucharist itself. The former is a sign, but one which merely points to a reality that remains absent. Writing the word "Eucharist" on a piece of paper does not turn the paper into Jesus. The latter, however, is a sign too, but is a sign that truly makes present the reality which it signifies; the bread and wine truly become the body and blood of Jesus Christ.

Now that we understand these two aspects of the sacraments, that they consist both of an outward sign, and that they truly make grace present, we can also understand the essence of sacramentality itself: God mediates Himself to us through His creation. God is able to use what He has created, such as bread and wine, and through it, bring us into union with Him. Thus, we can see that Christ is the primordial sacrament. By becoming incarnate in the person of Jesus Christ, God was made present to us by coming down to our level. God used a piece of creation, human nature, to save us, so that we might have eternal life with Him. Hence the Eucharist truly is the greatest sacrament, as it is the fullest expression of what a sacrament is. God is mediating Himself, in the Divinity of Jesus Christ, through an aspect of creation, human nature, i.e. body and blood of Jesus Christ. So, when we next receive this most Blessed Sacrament, perhaps we can reflect on its grandeur: the God Who is infinitely above us has, out of love, come to meet us in our weakness and finitude; He who has created all has come to us, His creation, through that very creation.






