

LUKE 13:22-30

Jesus passed through towns and villages, teaching as he went and making his way to Jerusalem. Someone asked him, "Lord, will only a few people be saved?" He answered them, "Strive to enter through the narrow gate, for many, I tell you, will attempt to enter but will not be strong enough. After the master of the house has arisen and locked the door, then will you stand outside knocking and saying, 'Lord, open the door for us.' WEEKLY REFLECTION ON THE EUCHARIST

The earliest Christians called Sunday "the Lord's Day" and "the Day of Resurrection." It was the day they gathered early in the morning for what they called the "breaking of the bread" (Luke 24:13-35, Acts of the Apostles 2:42). The "breaking of the bread" was a new term and the earliest, found in the New Testament, for what we today call Mass. We know that from the earliest days of Christianity, after Christ had risen and ascended, this was how Christians worshipped when they gathered on Sunday: they prayed, they sang songs of praise, they read Scripture, and they shared in the meal given to them by Christ at His last supper. What we call today "the Eucharist" was a constitutive part of their weekly worship. And that word — Eucharist, from a Greek word meaning "thanksgiving" — by the second century, only seventy years after Christ's resurrection, that is what Christians called their Sunday meeting: Eucharist. It seems natural enough. At the Last Supper, Jesus gave thanks to God. Giving thanks to God for the life given to us here and for the gift of eternal life through Christ our Savior, this is the heart of our communal prayer, and it has always been expressed in the offering and sharing of bread and wine, the body and blood of Christ. What we do on Sunday here in Marlton, New Jersey, at the Church of St. Joan of Arc, nearly two thousand years later, is the very same thing the first generations of Christians did.




