GOSPEL

Luke 16:1-13

Jesus said to his disciples,
"A rich man had a steward who was reported to him for squandering his property. He summoned him and said, 'What is this I hear about you? Prepare a full account of your stewardship, because you can no longer be my steward.' The steward said to himself, 'What shall I do, now that my master is taking the position of steward away from me? I am not strong enough to dig and I am ashamed to beg. I know what I shall do so that, when I am removed from the stewardship, they may welcome me into their homes.'

He called in his master's debtors one by one. To the first he said, 'How much do you owe my master?' He replied, 'One hundred measures of olive oil.' He said to him, 'Here is your promissory note. Sit down and quickly write one for fifty.' Then to another the steward said, 'And you, how much do you owe?' He replied, 'One hundred kors of wheat.' The steward said to him, 'Here is your promissory note; write one for eighty.' And the master commended that dishonest steward for acting prudently.

"For the children of this world are more prudent in dealing with their own generation than are the children of light. I tell you, make friends for yourselves with dishonest wealth, so that when it fails, you will be welcomed into eternal dwellings.

The person who is trustworthy in very small matters is also trustworthy in great ones; and the person who is dishonest in very small matters is also dishonest in great ones. If, therefore, you are not trustworthy with dishonest wealth, who will trust you with true wealth? If you are not trustworthy with what belongs to another, who will give you what is yours?

He will either hate one and love the other, or be devoted to one and despise the other.

You cannot serve both God and mammon."

WHEN YOUR WORLD CRASHES IN

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

There is no doubt about it: in this Sunday's Gospel we hear one of the more interesting, puzzling, even questionable parables told by Jesus. While some of the details are indeed head scratchers — like cheating the owner, making friends of dishonest wealth, to name two — if we take the story at it's core, we might be able to better apply the message to our lives today.

Essentially, the parable is a story about a fellow who is about to lose his steward's job due to either his own incompetence or shortsightedness or just plain poor management skills. He is in a bad way. Here is what he doesn't do: he doesn't complain, he doesn't mope around, he doesn't get angry or bitter, he doesn't shake a fist at heaven and blame God. Here is what he does: he assesses his abilities and skills, he develops a plan (albeit kind of a shady plan, but again, let's not get lost in the details) and he moves into action.

This is the kind of discipleship Jesus seems to admire and call us to. If we could put these traits — assessing our abilities, developing a plan and moving into action — on behalf of the Kingdom of God, imagine all the good we could do for ourselves and our families, for communities, our Church and our world!

Imagine!

Or, better yet: imagine and then get to work!

Eucharistic Reflection: Let the People Say "Amen!"

Question: Which of all the "amens" we say during Sunday Mass — and we say quite a few of them — is called the "Great Amen"?

Answer: The "Amen!" we say, usually sing, at the conclusion of the Eucharistic Prayer during which bread and wine have been consecrated and become the Body and Blood of Christ. The priests says or chants, "Through Him, with Him and In Him, all glory and honor is Yours, Almighty Father, forever and ever!" And we the people sing in response, "**Amen!**" This is called an *acclamation*. Acclamations aren't meant to be mumbled or whispered. They are like a cheer. Our "Amen" at the end of the Eucharistic Prayer is to be great and joyful, "Yes, absolutely, I agree! I believe!" All of our "amens" uttered during Mass, in fact, are said corporally, together, as one body. All, except for one. When we receive the Body of Christ (or Blood) individually, we also say, "Amen." It also should be a strong statement of conviction, of belief in what we are receiving. It doesn't need to be shouted, but it indeed should be heard. It is a personal witness. It should be spoken from the heart and even the head ... a full bodied, full souled response to the invitation to receive the Lord in the most precious, wonderful Sacrament of His Real Presence in the Eucharist!

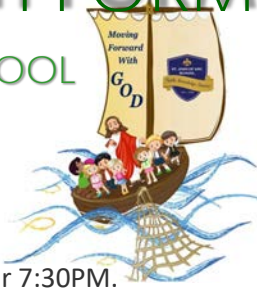
