GOSPEL

Luke 16:19-31

Jesus said to the Pharisees:

"There was a rich man who dressed in purple garments and fine linen and dined sumptuously each day. And lying at his door was a poor man named Lazarus, covered with sores, who would gladly have eaten his fill of the scraps that fell from the rich man's table. Dogs even used to come and lick his sores. When the poor man died, he was carried away by angels to the bosom of Abraham. The rich man also died and was buried, and from the netherworld, where he was in torment, he raised his eyes and saw Abraham far off and Lazarus at his side. And he cried out, 'Father Abraham, have pity on me. Send Lazarus to dip the tip of his finger in water and cool my tongue, for I am suffering torment in these flames.'

Abraham replied, 'My child, remember that you received what was good during your lifetime while Lazarus likewise received what was bad; but now he is comforted here, whereas you are tormented. Moreover, between us and you a great chasm is established to prevent anyone from crossing who might wish to go from our side to yours or from your side to ours.'

He said, 'Then I beg you, father, send him to my father's house, for I have five brothers, so that he may warn them, lest they too come to this place of torment.'

But Abraham replied, 'They have Moses and the prophets. Let them listen to them.'

He said, 'Oh no, father Abraham, but if someone from the dead goes to them, they will repent.'

Then Abraham said, 'If they will not listen to Moses and the prophets, neither will they be persuaded if someone should rise from the dead.'"

THE OTHER LAZARUS

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

One of Jesus' good friends was a man named Lazarus. Lazarus was the brother to Martha and Mary. He is also the man who died and was buried and when Jesus went to his tomb, Jesus wept. Then Jesus brought him back to life. In today's Gospel from Luke, Jesus tells a parable about a man named Lazarus. But not the same Lazarus, not Martha and Mary's brother, not the man Jesus brought back to life. The parable is about another Lazarus, more than likely a fictitious Lazarus, a character in one of Jesus' best known stories.

The Lazarus in this story is poor. Very poor. He eats the scraps that fall from the table of a rich man (whose name Jesus does not share, though tradition likes to call him Dives, a Latin word meaning "wealthy"). This Lazarus sits on the stoop of the rich man's house and is ignored. No one seems to take any notice of him, let alone help him — only the dogs take mercy, licking the sores that cover the poor man's body.

You probably know the rest of the story. Both the rich man and the poor man named Lazarus die. The man who had everything on earth ends up with nothing but torment and some worry (and, perhaps, some regret, but we are not told that). The man who had nothing, ends up at the side of Abraham in paradise. There is still a chasm. A gap, a large divide between them, just as there was while they were both alive on earth.

I don't know why Jesus gave the name "Lazarus" to the poor man in this story. In no other parable that I can recall does Jesus give names to the characters. Only in this one. And this name! Lazarus! The same name as one of his dearest friends. Perhaps Jesus is telling us this other Lazarus is just as dear a friend. This one whom no one notices, this one who has nothing, this one who dies alone, unloved. For this one, and for the many like him, back then and now, for them, the many Lazaruses, Jesus weeps.

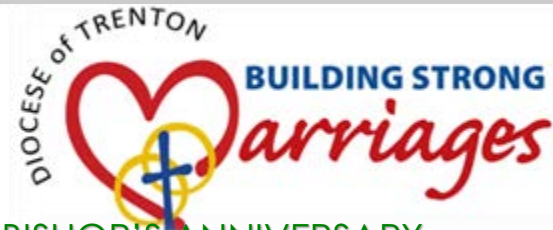
