GOSPEL

Lk 18:9-14

Jesus addressed this parable to those who were convinced of their own righteousness and despised everyone else. "Two people went up to the temple area to pray; one was a Pharisee and the other was a tax collector. The Pharisee took up his position and spoke this prayer to himself, 'O God, I thank you that I am not like the rest of humanity -- greedy, dishonest, adulterous -- or even like this tax collector. I fast twice a week, and I pay tithes on my whole income.' But the tax collector stood off at a distance and would not even raise his eyes to heaven but beat his breast and prayed, 'O God, be merciful to me a sinner.' I tell you, the latter went home justified, not the former; for whoever exalts himself will be humbled, and the one who humbles himself will be exalted."

This past Wednesday was the Feast of St. Isaac Jogues, a saint quite familiar to us. Born in France, Isaac came to the Americas in the 1600s to share and witness to the Gospel of Jesus Christ. He was martyred for it, as many other missionaries were. Twenty-five years ago, as we all know, our parish, named also for a saint from France, because of growing numbers, was split to help form the second Catholic parish in Marlton named for St. Isaac.

If you think you've never met a real, live missionary, someone who gives up home and security, someone who leaves family and friends to follow Christ's call to serve in another land ... think again! We have such a person right here in our midst. Fr. JM Patilla! And before him, Fr. Jorge Bedoya and Fr. Leon Buni. And before him, Fr. Francis Ravi. We've been blessed to know many missionaries here at St. Joan of Arc. Do not think because the threat to their physical lives is not as great today as it was to Jogues and his companions, do not dare to think these present day missionaries take any less a risk to come here. Would you do it?

YOUR SYNOD UPDATE

Synod means “to journey together.”



From January through April, 4, 198 people in the Diocese of Trenton participated in 835 listening sessions (this includes nearly 300 people who participated in 30 sessions right here at SJA). During the spring, these reports were synthesized into one Diocesan Report that was sent to the National Conference of Catholic Bishops. The results of our Diocesan Report are summarized below. JOYS ON THE JOURNEY TOGETHER

People in the Diocese of Trenton said these things gave them joy or helped them journey with the Church:

1. Serving and being involved in parish ministries
2. Mass and the Eucharist
3. Sacraments and rituals, prayers and devotion
4. Fellowship, beyond Mass, social and spiritual
5. Opportunities to grow in faith within small group settings, Bible studies, retreats, RCIA process
6. Comfort and support during difficult times (illness, struggle, loss, grief, infertility and adoption, etc.)
7. Found good role models; priest, sister, teacher, etc. really influenced my life.
8. Preachers with the ability to connect the gospel to daily lives in relevant ways.
9. Being a part of Catholic organizations and proud of the good works of Catholic institutions such as colleges, hospitals, social service agencies.

In next Sunday's Bulletin we will include a summary of the National Synthesis on all the Diocesan Reports from the United States.

OBSTACLES TO JOURNEYING TOGETHER

People in the Diocese of Trenton said these things have been obstacles for them in their journey with the Church:

1. Sadness that their adult children and grandchildren do not practice the faith
2. Sexual abuse by priests
3. Crisis of credibility and authority due to the abuse crisis, mismanagement, and lack of transparency in financial matters
4. Sense of loss from church and schools closing
5. Individuals and groups that do not fit the “mold” are not welcome
6. LGBTQ+ individuals feel alienated/experience rejection for who they are
7. Alienation of Divorced persons and those who've been divorced and remarried
8. Exclusion of women from leadership roles and decision-making in the church
9. Shortage of clergy and demands on their time
10. “The way things are” does not make it easy to participate
11. Polarization in the church
12. Change of pastor has a big impact on a parish for good or not for good
13. Clericalism and abuse of power by priests
14. Difficulties related to our lack of Communion with Christians of other churches

Notes:

1. Capital Expenditures include: Partial repavement of the parking lot, new forklift, Knight's Hall sound absorption panels, residence landscaping, and reconstruction of the trash dumpster area.
2. The Church borrowed \$1,100,000 in February of 2012 for the Church refurbishing project. The loan balance at June 30, 2022 is approximately \$330,000.
3. In prior years, Revenues in excess of Expenditures are transferred to the Operating and Capital Reserve Funds for future capital and operating needs, and for future loan repayment as necessary. This year, Expenditures were in excess of Revenues resulting in the use of prior year reserves.
