Better than a Mounds Bar

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

I love candy. Honest. I don't have a sweet tooth — I have sweet **teeth**, a whole mouthful of them. I could live on three meals a day of sugar in its many forms. So, when I say what I am about to say, you can believe me.

Here's what I want to say:

Jesus is better than sugar. Yes, Jesus is better than a bag full of M&Ms, Snickers and Kit Kats. That's right. Jesus is even better than chocolate chip ice cream.

Dressing up for Halloween is fun. Going from house to house or trunk to trunk is fun, too, no doubt about it. But Jesus is better.

So, I don't mean kids need to give up candy or stop trick or treating. Not at all. Kids should have their fun. What I do mean is we need to make sure our kids also have something of more substance in their life. Faith.

A relationship with Jesus. Prayer.

The high candy gives is fleeting and temporary (and often followed by the need for a long nap, for me, anyway). Halloween is fun, but quite frankly it is void of meaning. I've heard people today referring to Halloween as a "holiday." Yikes! This scares me more than any ghost or skeleton. I'd rather call it an event, a fun day. It is certainly not a "season," as some have made it into. Giving it "holiday" and "season" status equates it with Thanksgiving or with Christmas. Do we really want our kids to think Halloween is anywhere near as important as giving thanks to God or the birth of Christ?

Again, give the kids their fun and games, but please, also give them Sunday Mass. Give them the Eucharist. The gift of Christ! Give them prayer. Help them to believe in God. Teach them that God wants us to love each other the way Jesus loves us. And that God wants us to live forever with Him.

While dressing them, teach that Hallow means Holy. Let's give our kids help in becoming good, kind, generous, compassionate people. That's what holy people are.

Let them have fun on Halloween, but then bring them to Church the next day for All Saints (7am, 9am or 7pm Mass). Let Halloween be fun and also a moment to learn and to pray.

I do love sugar. I love it much too much, to be honest. But when my last day comes, on my deathbed, I pray God it's not a bowl of M&Ms I reach for. I pray it's a crucifix. I pray it's Jesus.

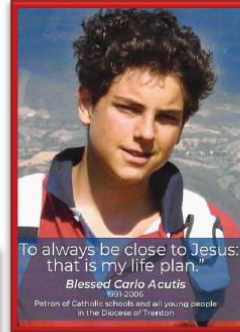

YOUR SYNOD UPDATE

The National Synthesis — Part One



SYNOD: To Journey Together

This past summer, regional boards summarized reports from every diocese across the United States (the Diocese of Trenton is part of Region 3, New Jersey and Pennsylvania). From these summary reports, the U.S. Bishops Conference wrote and just recently released the **National Synthesis** which can be read on www.usccb.org. (You can also read each of the Regional Reports.) This Synthesis will be sent to a Continental Board and then to the Vatican for the Synod of Bishops' Meeting in October of 2023 and 2024. This **National Synthesis** is formed from the experiences of over 700,000 persons who participated in over 30,000 in-person and virtual listening sessions and surveys, a great example of journeying together!

The National Synthesis begins with a section on what it terms, “Enduring Wounds.” Below are excerpts. In next week’s bulletin we will highlight the next section of the Synthesis called “Enhancing Communion and Participation.”

ENDURING WOUNDS

“Chief among the enduring wounds that afflict the People of God in the United States is the still unfolding effects of the **sexual abuse crisis**.”

“The sense of community among the People of God has also suffered from **the ongoing effects of the Covid-19 pandemic**.”

“Another enduring wound widely reflected in synodal consultations was **the experience that the Church is deeply divided**.”

“Many regional syntheses cited **the perceived lack of unity among the bishops in the United States**, and even of some individual bishops with the Holy Father, as a source of grave scandal.”

“Closely related to the wound of polarization is **the wound of marginalization**. Not only do those who experience this wound suffer, but their marginalization has become a source of scandal for others, especially for some youth who perceive the Church as hypocritical and failing to act consistently with justice toward these diverse communities.” Marginalized communities discussed include: immigrant communities, ethnic minorities, the undocumented; the unborn and their mothers; the poor; those with disabilities and mental health issues, those with addictions; women; those in the LGBTQ+ community, those divorced.

“The synodal consultations around the enduring wounds caused by the clergy sexual abuse scandal, the pandemic, polarization, and marginalization have exposed a deep hunger for healing and the strong desire for communion, community, and a sense of belonging and being united. “Throughout the synodal process, it was evident that most participants genuinely believe that support for one another is essential –laity and clergy; Churched and unchurched; and those in need of healing.”

FAITH SHARING QUESTIONS

Think of a person who is a known sinner who blatantly disregards their faith and the gospel. What would you do if Jesus told you He wasn't coming to your home for dinner, but to that person's home? Jealous, angry, confused? How would you feel?

Have you ever desired to see something so much that you've gone to ridiculous lengths to see it – a concert or a show, or someone? Does this help you relate to Zacchaeus wanting to see Jesus?

How about you... do you want to see Him?

SPIRITUAL ADOPTION 2ND MONTH

Thank you on behalf of all the unborn babies that cannot speak for themselves. We would like to thank all those families who agreed to participate in the spiritual adoption program. You spiritually adopted baby is 10,000 times bigger than at conception and has developed the foundations of his brain, spinal cord and nervous system by the 20th day. His heart began to beat on the 21st day after conception and is pumping blood through his circulatory system. Pray that the Lord of Life moves the heart of the mother to give the baby the most precious gift of all - the gift of life. Please pray daily the Prayer of Bishop Fulton J. Sheen: Jesus, Mary and Joseph, I love you very much. I beg you to spare the life of the unborn child that I have spiritually adopted who may be in danger of abortion. Amen.
