Luke 23:35-43

The rulers sneered at Jesus and said,

"He saved others, let him save himself if he is the chosen one, the Christ of God." Even the soldiers jeered at him. As they approached to offer him wine they called out, "If you are King of the Jews, save yourself." Above him there was an inscription that read, "This is the King of the Jews."

Now one of the criminals hanging there reviled Jesus, saying, "Are you not the Christ? Save yourself and us." The other, however, rebuking him, said in reply, "Have you no fear of God, for you are subject to the same condemnation? And indeed, we have been condemned justly, for the sentence we received corresponds to our crimes, but this man has done nothing criminal." Then he said, "Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom." He replied to him, "Amen, I say to you, today you will be with me in Paradise."

CHRIST THE KING/LAST SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME/2022 "YOU KNOW THE NAME OF THE KING"

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

Crucifixion is no laughing matter. And yet, reading Luke's account of Jesus' crucifixion seems filled with laughter. Laughter of the deriding kind. Laughter that sneers and jeers. Mocking laughter. The leaders who connived to have Jesus betrayed are laughing. The soldiers who had the gruesome task of hammering nails into his hands and feet are laughing. Even a criminal who himself has been put onto a cross is doing it, too. Laughing at Jesus.

It is during this most cruel, terrible, heartbreaking scene that we hear one of the most tender conversations in all of the Gospels.

The other criminal, the one tradition calls, "good," he does not mock or jeer or sneer. He doesn't laugh. After chiding his partner in crime, this man speaks Jesus' name. "Jesus," he says. "Remember me when you come into your kingdom." It is a humble request. It is a prayer. It is a dying man's act of faith. Jesus promises him that today he will be with Him in paradise.

This criminal knows Jesus' name and Jesus says He will know the criminal beyond death. O Lord, may it be so for each of us!

The bishops' vision is "to raise up Eucharistic missionaries at all levels of the Church."

June 11, 2023 Year of Parish Revival

The second phase will foster Eucharistic devotion at the parish level, strengthening liturgical life through Eucharistic adoration, missions, resources, preaching and organic movements of the Holy Spirit. These local efforts hope to convert hearts and minds to fall more deeply in love with Jesus in the Eucharist.

July 17 - 21, 2024 National Eucharistic Congress

Prepare for the Catholic event of the decade! More than 80,000 Catholics of all ages will gather at this historic event in Indianapolis to worship Jesus in the Eucharist. The Holy Spirit will be called upon to enkindle a missionary fire in the heart of our nation as we reconsecrate ourselves to the source and summit of our faith, Jesus in the Eucharist.

July 2024 - July 2025 National Year of Mission

From the Congress in 2024 through Pentecost of 2025, the American Church will be sent on mission to share the gift of our Eucharistic Jesus with our local communities and beyond. Let the light shine forth!


