

## GOSPEL Jn 4:5-15, 19b-26, 39a, 40-42

Jesus came to a town of Samaria called Sychar, near the plot of land that Jacob had given to his son Joseph. Jacob's well was there. Jesus, tired from his journey, sat down there at the well. It was about noon.

A woman of Samaria came to draw water. Jesus said to her, "Give me a drink." His disciples had gone into the town to buy food. The Samaritan woman said to him, "How can you, a Jew, ask me, a Samaritan woman, for a drink?" —For Jews use nothing in common with Samaritans. — Jesus answered and said to her, "If you knew the gift of God and who is saying to you, 'Give me a drink, 'you would have asked him and he would have given you living water." he woman said to him, "Sir, you do not even have a bucket and the cistern is deep; where then can you get this living water? Are you greater than our father Jacob, who gave us this cistern and drank from it himself with his children and his flocks?" Jesus answered and said to her, "Everyone who drinks this water will be thirsty again; but whoever drinks the water I shall give will never thirst; the water I shall give will become in him a spring of water welling up to eternal life." The woman said to him, "Sir, give me this water, so that I may not be thirsty or have to keep coming here to draw water. "I can see that you are a prophet. Our ancestors worshiped on this mountain; but you people say that the place to worship is in Jerusalem." Jesus said to her, "Believe me, woman, the hour is coming when you will worship the Father neither on this mountain nor in Jerusalem. You people worship what you do not understand; we worship what we understand, because salvation is from the Jews. But the hour is coming, and is now here, when true worshipers will worship the Father in Spirit and truth; and indeed the Father seeks such people to worship him. God is Spirit, and those who worship him must worship in Spirit and truth." The woman said to him, "I know that the Messiah is coming, the one called the Christ; when he comes, he will tell us everything." Jesus said to her, "I am he, the one who is speaking with you."

Many of the Samaritans of that town began to believe in him. When the Samaritans came to him, they invited him to stay with them; and he stayed there two days. Many more began to believe in him because of his word, and they said to the woman, "We no longer believe because of your word; for we have heard for ourselves, and we know that this is truly the savior of the world."

# 3<sup>rd</sup> Sunday of Lent / 2023 "Well. of course!"

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

Jesus meets a Samaritan woman by a well. Jacob's well, it's called. It's there, by a well that Jesus and the woman have a conversation. The conversation begins when Jesus asks her for a drink of water. It quickly gets deep, as deep as the well. Jesus knows her. Jesus knows her deepest thirst.

It is there by the well, in that encounter, in that conversation, that the woman begins to recognize who this Jesus is. Her heart is stirred. Her eyes begin to open. He is more than just a man. More than a prophet. He is the Messiah, and by the end of the story, the woman and many people of that town know Jesus as the Savior of the world. Which means: Jesus is the well.

That day the woman went to Jacob's well and she met Jesus, the Wellspring of Living Water.

It's the third week in Lent. Easter is still four Sundays away. It's a long season. Well, of course it is. Lent doesn't diddle with the surface of things. Lent wants to move us, take us, deeper.


When Jesus asks you for a drink of water, what He is really asking for is your heart.


