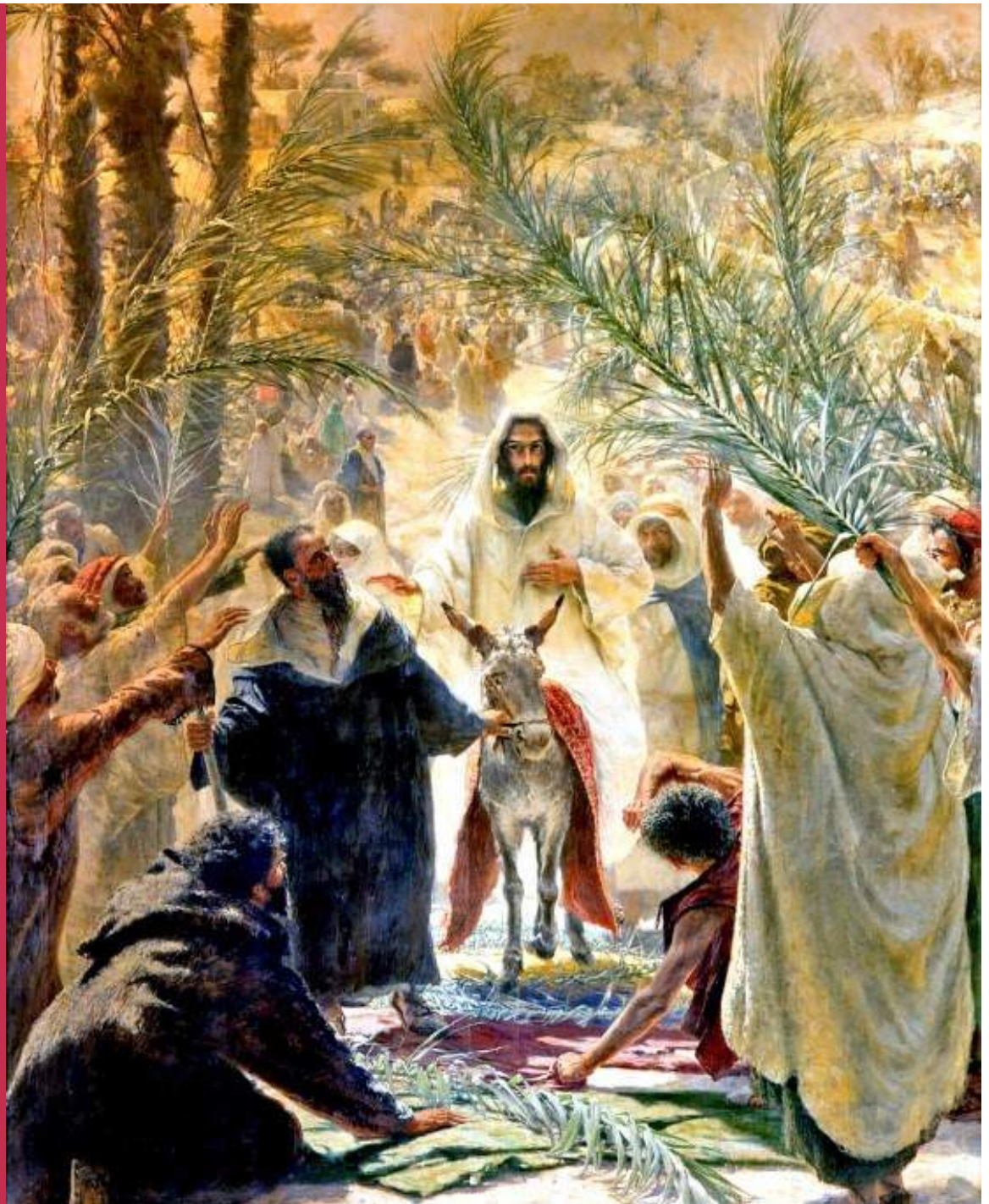

GOSPEL MATTHEW 27:11-54

Jesus stood before the governor, Pontius Pilate, who questioned him, "Are you the king of the Jews?" Jesus said, "You say so." And when he was accused by the chief priests and elders, he made no answer. Then Pilate said to him, "Do you not hear how many things they are testifying against you?" But he did not answer him one word, so that the governor was greatly amazed.

Now on the occasion of the feast the governor was accustomed to release to the crowd one prisoner whom they wished. And at that time they had a notorious prisoner called Barabbas. So when they had assembled, Pilate said to them, "Which one do you want me to release to you, Barabbas, or Jesus called Christ?" For he knew that it was out of envy that they had handed him over. While he was still seated on the bench, his wife sent him a message, "Have nothing to do with that righteous man. I suffered much in a dream today because of him." The chief priests and the elders persuaded the crowds to ask for Barabbas but to destroy Jesus. The governor said to them in reply, "Which of the two do you want me to release to you?" They answered, Barabbas!" Pilate said to them, "Then what shall I do with Jesus called Christ?" They all said, "Let him be crucified!" But he said, "Why? What evil has he done?" They only shouted the louder, "Let him be crucified!" When Pilate saw that he was not succeeding at all, but that a riot was breaking out instead, he took water and washed his hands in the sight of the crowd, saying, "I am innocent of this man's blood. Look to it yourselves." And the whole people said in reply, "His blood be upon us and upon our children." Then he released Barabbas to them, but after he had Jesus scourged, he handed him over to be crucified.

Then the soldiers of the governor took Jesus inside the praetorium and gathered the whole cohort around him. They stripped off his clothes and threw a scarlet military cloak about him. Weaving a crown out of thorns, they placed it on his head, and a reed in his right hand. And kneeling before him, they mocked him, saying, "Hail, King of the Jews!" They spat upon him and took the reed and kept striking him on the head. And when they had mocked him, they stripped him of the cloak, dressed him in his own clothes, and led him off to crucify him.

As they were going out, they met a Cyrenian named Simon; this man they pressed into service to carry his cross.

And when they came to a place called Golgotha — which means Place of the Skull —, they gave Jesus wine to drink mixed with gall. But when he had tasted it, he refused to drink. After they had crucified him, they divided his garments by casting lots; then they sat down and kept watch over him there. And they placed over his head the written charge against him: This is Jesus, the King of the Jews. Two revolutionaries were crucified with him, one on his right and the other on his left. Those passing by reviled him, shaking their heads and saying, "You who would destroy the temple and rebuild it in three days, save yourself, if you are the Son of God, and come down from the cross!" Likewise the chief priests with the scribes and elders mocked him and said, "He saved others; he cannot save himself. So he is the king of Israel! Let him come down from the cross now, and we will believe in him. He trusted in God; let him deliver him now if he wants him. For he said, 'I am the Son of God.'" The revolutionaries who were crucified with him also kept abusing him in the same way.

From noon onward, darkness came over the whole land until three in the afternoon. And about three o'clock Jesus cried out in a loud voice, "*Eli, Eli, lema sabachthani?*" which means, "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?" Some of the bystanders who heard it said, "This one is calling for Elijah." Immediately one of them ran to get a sponge; he soaked it in wine, and putting it on a reed, gave it to him to drink. But the rest said, "Wait, let us see if Elijah comes to save him." But Jesus cried out again in a loud voice, and gave up his spirit.

And behold, the veil of the sanctuary was torn in two from top to bottom. The earth quaked, rocks were split, tombs were opened, and the bodies of many saints who had fallen asleep were raised. And coming forth from their tombs after his resurrection, they entered the holy city and appeared to many. The centurion and the men with him who were keeping watch over Jesus feared greatly when they saw the earthquake and all that was happening, and they said,

"Truly, this was the Son of God!"

FAITH SHARING QUESTIONS

The last 5 weeks we have journeyed with Jesus. Let us consider who we might continue this journey.

What has to change in your life to open your heart and live fully to trust in Him, completely?

Take your thoughts to the Easter Celebration of His resurrection – and make that prayer to Him.

Palm Sunday / 2023

“A different holy, Holy Week”

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

It has been wonderful to see so many people — especially young families — returning to Sunday Mass. I anticipate larger crowds today on Palm Sunday ... so a heartfelt welcome to all. Palm Sunday celebrates the day Jesus entered into Jerusalem, an event, of course, that would lead to His crucifixion, burial and ultimate resurrection. Today also marks our entrance into the holiest week of the year for us as Catholics. We join Christians around the world (over 2 billion of us) as we walk together with Christ.

I know many of you will be very busy this week preparing the Easter Sunday dinner. Those with young children will be busy fixing up Easter baskets and hiding eggs (boy, how I loved the candy part of Easter when I was a kid!). You may also be busy buying a new Easter outfit. All of this is good and will help Easter be the beautiful celebration of Christ's resurrection that it should be.

In the midst of all of the above, can I also ask you to think about how you will make Holy Week experienced at home, while also hopefully planning to come the Sacred liturgies of Holy Thursday, Good Friday and, of course Easter Sunday? It can start by taking the palm you receive today and bringing it home and placing it behind a crucifix in your house. Don't just put it in a drawer.

Holy Thursday, Good Friday, Holy Saturday and Easter (what the Church calls the Paschal Triduum) should look and feel different than any other days of the year.

Perhaps on Holy Thursday the household table could be set in a special way for the dinner, in order to help everyone remember Jesus' Last Supper.

Good Friday, the day we commemorate the crucifixion and death of our Savior, should certainly be a day with as little activity as possible. Certainly we can “unplug” our lives between the hours of noon and three, as Jesus hung on the cross.

On Holy Saturday, as the Lord Jesus lay in the tomb, is there a way to find time to rest, to pray, to do spiritual reading, to reflect and journal a bit about what all of this means, Jesus' dying and rising, what it means to you, how it touches your heart and affects your life, how it changes the way you live. (Trust me, I know it is difficult to find the time to do this, but if we managed to do it, think of the good it could do!)

On Holy Saturday night, our celebration begins with the most important Mass of the year called the Easter Vigil. We will be baptizing and confirming adults that evening. I ask that you keep them in your prayers.

Speaking of prayer, this week should be filled with it. Consciously pray not just for your own needs and the needs of your family, but make your prayers big. Unite your prayers to those around the world longing for peace, for their next meal, for a safe home, for those taking their last breaths.

Please put the Holy Week Schedule in the bulletin on your bulletin board or refrigerator at home. I hope to see you many times throughout the week. On behalf of Fr. JM and Fr. Richard, know that you will be in our prayers. Let's all make it a different kind of week. A holy, Holy Week.

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

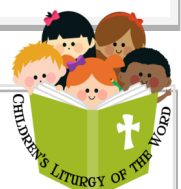

Our next meeting will be held on Wednesday, April 12th.

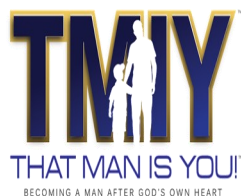

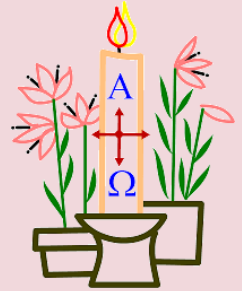


PASCHAL CANDLE

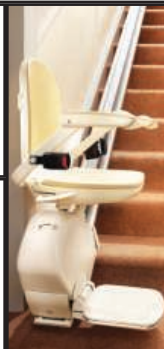
