

#### Ascension of the Lord / 2024 Mother's Day! EASTER ASCENSION and MOTHERS

#### Dear Parishioners and Friends,

Welcome to Ascension **Sunday**! I'm sure that still sounds a bit odd to ears attuned to hearing "Ascension **Thursday**." Personally, I love the fact that we have transferred it to Sunday. Let's be honest: the majority of Catholics never celebrated this Solemnity until its move. Christ's Ascension is important because without it, there would be no Pentecost, no giving of the Holy Spirit. Christ returns to His heavenly Father and sends His Spirit upon His followers. Without the Ascension there would be no us. No Church.

This year's Ascension Sunday is special because it falls on Mother's Day. Let's be honest again: for the most part, faith in Jesus gets handed down, generation to generation, by mothers. It's the women in our lives and in our parishes who do much of the work of the Church, especially in the essential departments of teaching, catechizing and even daily praying. Without all that women do here we could easily say there would be no St. Joan of Arc Parish. We owe them a debt of gratitude!

The Feast of the Ascension usually falls in the month of May, the month Catholics offer special acknowledgement of and prayer with Mary, the Mother of God & Mother of the Church. If you haven't prayed a rosary in quite some time, this would be a good time to pick one up again. To help you pray we have a new ministry: a **traveling statue of Our Lady of Fatima.** This statue may be brought to your home for a week to help all the members of your household (friends and neighbors, too!) to gather and pray. Please see the notice in this bulletin on the details of signing up and receiving the statue. We have also placed around the perimeter of the church's interior various images of the Blessed Mother. In the bulletin are various prayers that can be said at each **"Marian Station."** 

It was at the wedding feast of Cana that Mary, speaking of her Son, said to the wine stewards: "Do whatever He tells you." It was our mothers who, perhaps not in precisely the same words, have advised and urged us at one time in our life or another to do what Jesus tells us. In Mark's Gospel, just before His ascension into heaven, Jesus Christ tells His disciples to "go into the whole world and proclaim the gospel to every creature." He tells us the same. Let's pray, through the intercession of Holy Mary, Mother of God, that we listen to Jesus and do all that He has told us to do. After all, this is what the Church is for. Without evangelization, there would no Church.

Speaking of Church and Evangelization: next Sunday is **Pentecost!** We have two great ways to conclude our Easter Season. On Saturday, May 18, our Evangelization Team is holding a **Parish Retreat.** All are invited for this time of prayer, reflection and inspiration; details are in this bulletin. Then on Sunday, May 19, I hope to see you at our **Parish Picnic** which is always a great celebration of who we are as a parish community.

#### **RELIGIOUS EDUCATION Congratulations to**

our First Communicants! Over the past two weekends, about 160 children from our parish and school have received their First Holy Communion here at St. Joan of Arc. We are very grateful to the catechists, teachers, and aides who have given so generously of their time and talent to help our children prepare for this beautiful Sacrament.

#### Summer Program catechist openings!

Our Summer Program is a one week, full-day intensive program for children in grades 1st through 8th. We are offering this popular option this year according to the following schedule:

#### June 24 - June 28, Monday - Friday, 8:30 am - 2:30 pm and July 8 - 12, Monday - Friday 8:30 am - 2:30 pm

During these weeks, our children attend Mass each morning, work with our music teacher to learn music for Mass, work on service projects, take "field trips" to our prayer garden and other places on our campus, and generally spend the week immersed in learning about and living their faith. As we have moved to this full-day intensive option this year, we are looking for catechists who also teach professionally, as the full-day context of the program requires professional classroom management training and experience. As this is a requirement which goes beyond our normal catechist qualifications, and due to the fact that the program runs during the traditional work day, a stipend is also offered for teachers during each of the Summer Program weeks. (Teachers can be currently employed or retired.) While we are seeking professional teachers for our Summer Program, teachers must primarily be motivated to share their faith with the children they teach, which is the first and most important gualification of a catechist in any context. # NATIONAL Eucharistic Pilgrimage

#### **Trenton Diocese - National Eucharistic Pilgrimage**

A historic National Eucharistic Procession begins this month on the weekend of Pentecost, May 17-19, 2024. The routes are set, stops are finalized, and dioceses across the country are eagerly preparing to welcome the Blessed Sacrament on the way to the 10<sup>th</sup> National Eucharistic Congress.

None of us have ever seen anything like this before! Four different routes of Procession will cover more than 6,000 miles and pass through nearly 70 dioceses and archdioceses, making this **the longest Eucharistic procession in U.S. history**!

The Trenton Diocese is blessed to be on the <u>St. Elizabeth Ann Seton Route.</u> The Eucharist will be processed through our Diocese on **Tuesday May 28<sup>th</sup>**, **Wednesday May 29<sup>th</sup>**, **and Thursday May 30<sup>th</sup>**. On each of these days our Bishop, the Most Reverend David O'Connell C.M., will celebrate Mass. Each Mass will be livestreamed by the Trenton Diocese (on Wednesday, Bishop O'Connell will celebrate the evening Mass).

#### MARY STATUE HOME VISIT

Parishioners can now sign up to host the traveling statue of Mary (Our Lady of Fatima) in your home. The sign-up sheet will be located in the Church's Gathering/Cry Room. Those

- The statue is placed at her shrine that you've created for the week.
- Family and friends gather around their heavenly Mother and pray.

What is included? The statue is housed in a rolling travel case that is padded for her protection. Also included is a guidebook with suggested prayers to follow during her visit and a rosary.

**Timing** Sign-up on the sign-up sheet. When it is your week, you simply **pick** up the Mary Statue in its rolling travel case at 11 am (on Sunday) from the Church Gathering/Cry Room. You will host the statue at your house until the following Sunday. 
