GOSPEL

Mk 3: 20-35

Jesus came home with his disciples. Again the crowd gathered, making it impossible for them even to eat. When his relatives heard of this they set out to seize him, for they said, "He is out of his mind." The scribes who had come from Jerusalem said, "He is possessed by Beelzebul," and "By the prince of demons he drives out demons."

Summoning them, he began to speak to them in parables, "How can Satan drive out Satan? If a kingdom is divided against itself, that kingdom cannot stand. And if a house is divided against itself, that house will not be able to stand. And if Satan has risen up against himself and is divided, he cannot stand; that is the end of him. But no one can enter a strong man's house to plunder his property unless he first ties up the strong man. Then he can plunder the house. Amen, I say to you, all sins and all blasphemies that people utter will be forgiven them. But whoever blasphemes against the Holy Spirit will never have forgiveness, but is guilty of an everlasting sin."

For they had said, "He has an unclean spirit."

His mother and his brothers arrived. Standing outside they sent word to him and called him. A crowd seated around him told him, "Your mother and your brothers and your sisters are outside asking for you." But he said to them in reply, "Who are my mother and my brothers?" And looking around at those seated in the circle he said, "Here are my mother and my brothers. For whoever does the will of God is my brother and sister and mother."

CRAZY LIKE JESUS

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

Jesus was crazy. Don't yell at me if you think that is a rather blasphemous thing to say. I'm only quoting His relatives. (You can always count on your relatives, right?)

What did Jesus' aunts and uncles see or hear in Jesus that made them say, as we hear in today's Gospel, "He is out of his mind"? (Mk. 3:2-35)

Some of the Scribes (experts on the Law) took it a step further. They claimed Jesus was possessed, that He was working for "the prince of demons." What could they have possibly seen in *Jesus*, what could Jesus have possibly said, that would lead them to *that* conclusion.

What do you think? Do you think Jesus was crazy?

Chances are good, you do not think that. But here's the point: from the time Jesus walked the earth until now, people (even people who believe in Him as Lord and Savior, as the Son of God, like us) have come up with all sorts of ways, if not to completely dismiss Jesus, than to get around what He says and find excuses for not actually DOING what He says.

His relatives thought Him crazy. Scribes thought Him in league with the devil. Today we might accuse Jesus of being "unrealistic," too "pie in the sky" (who can *really* love their enemies?), and therefore not very practical or relevant. We even sort of write Him off when we say, "Well, Jesus could do those things (like loving enemies) because He is God and we are not."

Here is something Jesus said: anyone who does the will of God is His "brother and sister and mother." Let's not write Him off and say, "Well, who really knows what the will of God is?"

We do.

We know what the will of God is because God shows us and tells us what God's will is in the very birth, life, ministry, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. The Trinity may be a mystery. But the will of God is not! Doing the will of God is hard, yes, and maybe the hardest thing about it is **believing it is doable.**

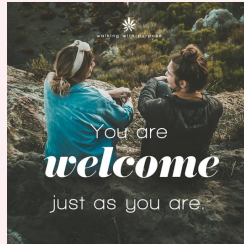

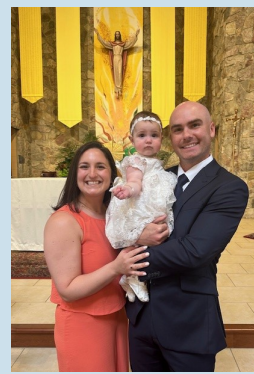

No mow, slow mow...Lawns cover 2% of the land in the USA. They are mowed, raked, fertilized, weeded, chemically treated and watered. Lawns provide little benefit to wildlife and are often harmful.

Grass-only lawns lack flowers for pollinators and trees for nesting birds. Pesticides can often harm bees. If you mow your yard regularly, try to let the grass grow a bit between mowings, don't use pesticides and plant as many flowers and trees as you can!

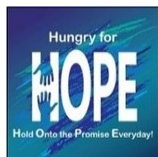
