GOSPEL Jn 6:1-15

Jesus went across the Sea of Galilee. A large crowd followed him, because they saw the signs he was performing on the sick. Jesus went up on the mountain, and there he sat down with his disciples. The Jewish feast of Passover was near. When Jesus raised his eyes and saw that a large crowd was coming to him, he said to Philip, "Where can we buy enough food for them to eat?" He said this to test him, because he himself knew what he was going to do. Philip answered him, "Two hundred days' wages worth of food would not be enough for each of them to have a little." One of his disciples, Andrew, the brother of Simon Peter, said to him, "There is a boy here who has five barley loaves and two fish; but what good are these for so many?" Jesus said, "Have the people recline." Now there was a great deal of grass in that place. So the men reclined, about five thousand in number. Then Jesus took the loaves, gave thanks, and distributed them to those who were reclining, and also as much of the fish as they wanted. When they had had their fill, he said to his disciples, "Gather the fragments left over, so that nothing will be wasted." So they collected them, and filled twelve wicker baskets with fragments from the five barley loaves that had been more than they could eat. When the people saw the sign he had done, they said, "This is truly the Prophet, the one who is to come into the world." Since Jesus knew that they were going to come and carry him off to make him king, he withdrew again to the mountain alone.

17th Sunday Ordinary Time / 2024 **ROLLING EYES**

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

First: If you are wondering why all of a sudden we have, in the Year of St. Mark, a gospel passage from St. John, here's why: Mark's Gospel is short and cannot fill in the entire liturgical calendar, so the Church dips into the Gospel of John to "fill in." We'll be back to Mark in September.

Second, and more importantly: Today's Gospel is a familiar one. The miracle of the multiplication of the loaves and fishes is found in all four Gospels, but I think I personally like best John's telling of it. In John's Gospel we hear of the disciples' exasperation over the problem at hand: a very large and hungry crowd and no food to feed them. We also hear of Andrew, one of the twelve, who does notice and points out, with a bit of hopefulness, a boy in the crowd who has five barley loaves and two fishes. Then sinking into defeatism, Andrew quickly adds, "But what good are these for so many."

What follows is the part I really love. Jesus apparently completely ignores Andrew's negativity. Tell everyone to sit down, He says (actually, recline, because that was the eating position back then). In my imagination (not reported in the Gospel), I see Jesus rolling his eyes at the apostles' lack of imagination, lack of trust, lack of hope, lack of faith. Jesus overlooks all this "lack of" and with very little does very much.

I also see the apostles' rolling their eyes when Jesus lifts up a couple of loaves of bread and blesses them. It makes me think: How many times have I rolled my eyes at the Gospel, thinking it naïve, too pie in the sky, nice sentiment but not very realistic in the real world.

Who knows? For every time I've rolled my eyes, maybe there have been Divine Eyes rolling right back at me. Open your eyes, Jesus may be saying. Look at all the love of God can do!!






