

## Mk 9:38-43, 45, 47-48

At that time, John said to Jesus, "Teacher, we saw someone driving out demons in your name, and we tried to prevent him because he does not follow us." Jesus replied, "Do not prevent him. There is no one who performs a mighty deed in my name who can at the same time speak ill of me. For whoever is not against us is for us. Anyone who gives you a cup of water to drink because you belong to Christ, amen, I say to you, will surely not lose his reward.

"Whoever causes one of these little ones who believe in me to sin, it would be better for him if a great millstone were put around his neck and he were thrown into the sea. If your hand causes you to sin, cut it off. It is better for you to enter into life maimed than with two hands to go into Gehenna, into the unquenchable fire. And if your foot causes you to sin, cut if off. It is better for you to enter into life crippled than with two feet to be thrown into Gehenna. And if your eye causes you to sin, pluck it out. Better for you to enter into the kingdom of God with one eye than with two eyes to be thrown into Gehenna, where 'their worm does not die, and the fire is not quenched.'" ## 26th Sunday Ordinary Time / 2024 SYNOD: "I'M BACK"

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

Just when you thought it was safe to go to Church again and not hear the word "Synod," it's back! It never went away, actually. But a refresher might be called for.

Synod — though a relatively new word to many of us — is a very old Church word. It comes from a Greek word that means "journey together." It has, for most of Christian history, referred to a gathering of Bishops or Church leaders. After Vatican II, Pope Paul VI called for a Synod of Bishops selected from around the world every three years, with extra-ordinary Synods called when needed. During these meetings, the Bishops would advise the Pope on a particular topic of concern to the universal Church, or in some cases, to a specific region.

Pope Francis has expanded the Synod of Bishops to include input from the entire Church. As you know, hundreds of our parishioners, joined thousands upon thousands of Catholics, practicing and non-practicing, from around the world, as well as even non-Catholics in providing feedback to the Pope. They issue in question was: what are the joys and the challenges we experience as we journey together as Church.

Last October (2023) in Rome, Pope Francis and Bishops from around the world met in synod with lay women and men, as well as priests and women religious. This was the first part of a two part meeting. Study Groups have been formed to discuss several important questions. The second part meets again in Rome during the month of October this year.

You can read the working document to be used in the upcoming session this October, as well as others relating to the Synod. Stay informed. Don't just read what others say about the Synod; read the documents themselves. Go to the Vatican website or the links below. What is occurring is important. Please keep the Synod in your daily prayers.


