

Mk 10:46-52

As Jesus was leaving Jericho with his disciples and a sizable crowd, Bartimaeus, a blind man, the son of Timaeus, sat by the roadside begging. On hearing that it was Jesus of Nazareth, he began to cry out and say, "Jesus, son of David, have pity on me." And many rebuked him, telling him to be silent. But he kept calling out all the more, "Son of David, have pity on me." Jesus stopped and said, "Call him." So they called the blind man, saying to him, "Take courage; get up, Jesus is calling you." He threw aside his cloak, sprang up, and came to Jesus. Jesus said to him in reply, "What do you want me to do for you?" The blind man replied to him, "Master, I want to see." 30th Sunday Ordinary Time / 2024 A FACE IN THE CROWD

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

Today we meet a group of people in the Gospel usually called "the crowd" (Mark 10:46-52). A sizable crowd, we are told, some disciples among them, are following Jesus as he leaves Jericho on His way to Jerusalem.

In the Gospels, "the crowd" can be fickle. We know this only too well during Holy Week, when on Sunday they are waving palms and crying out to Jesus, "Hosanna in the highest!" and by Friday they are urging Pontius Pilate to "crucify him."

Today they seem no less fickle. At first they urge Bartimaeus, a blind man, to keep his mouth shut as Jesus walks by, and then, when Jesus wants to see the man, the crowd urges him to "take courage, get up and go to Jesus."

Amazingly, we see how the crowd itself undergoes a conversion, so strong is an encounter with Christ. The crowd comes to see Bartimaeus, a blind beggar, not as a nuisance, an embarrassment, a problem to be rid of, but as a person, a person worthy of dignity and respect.

How often do I lump people into a crowd, a category, a racial/ethnic group, a political party, a group of this kind or that kind, those who are "in" or "out," "wanted" or unwanted"?

"Lord Jesus, open my eyes and help me see every face in the crowd as a unique individual, a child of God, a sister and brother!"


This Thanksgiving Dinner is intended for all to enjoy a hot meal, musical entertainment and an opportunity for fellowship with other members of the community!
