GOSPEL Lk 3:10-18

The crowds asked John the Baptist, "What should we do?" He said to them in reply, "Whoever has two cloaks should share with the person who has none. And whoever has food should do likewise." Even tax collectors came to be baptized and they said to him, "Teacher, what should we do?" He answered them, "Stop collecting more than what is prescribed." Soldiers also asked him, "And what is it that we should do?" He told them, "Do not practice extortion, do not falsely accuse anyone, and be satisfied with your wages."

Now the people were filled with expectation, and all were asking in their hearts whether John might be the Christ. John answered them all, saying, "I am baptizing you with water, but one mightier than I is coming. I am not worthy to loosen the thongs of his sandals. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire. His winnowing fan is in his hand to clear his threshing floor and to gather the wheat into his barn, but the chaff he will burn with unquenchable fire." Exhorting them in many other ways, he preached good news to the people.

3rd Sunday of Advent / 2024 **A REASON TO REJOICE**

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

Officially, the Third Sunday of Advent is known as Rejoice Sunday! In Latin, it's GAUDETE! In our second reading, St. Paul emphatically urges (nearly commands) the Philippians (and us) to rejoice. "Rejoice," the apostle says. "Again, I say, REJOICE!"

In the very same letter, St. Paul also tells the Philippians (and us), "Your kindness should be known to all."

I'm thinking it wouldn't be such a bad idea to call this Sunday, "Be Kind and Rejoice Sunday."

The Latin word for "kindness" is "Beneficentia," which means "Good Will." To have good will for another ... in other words, to want the good, the best, for another. That truly is kindness.

Furthermore, "kindness" finds in its Old English roots the word, "Kin." When showing kindness, we show that we are not strangers. Indeed, we are related. We are family.

Would it not be wonderful, incredible, phenomenal, to be known for your kindness? That would be reason to rejoice!


