GOSPEL Lk 3:1-6

In the fifteenth year of the reign of Tiberius Caesar, when Pontius Pilate was governor of Judea, and Herod was tetrarch of Galilee, and his brother Philip tetrarch of the region of Ituraea and Trachonitis, and Lysanias was tetrarch of Abilene, during the high priesthood of Annas and Caiaphas, the word of God came to John the son of Zechariah in the desert. John went throughout the whole region of the Jordan, proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins, as it is written in the book of the words of the prophet Isaiah:

## 2nd Sunday of Advent / 2024 THIS HAPPENED!

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

St. Luke is emphatic. He gives dates. He gives names. He gives a specific historical context. Tiberious Caesar was the Roman Emperor. Pontius Pilate was the Roman appointed governor of Judea. Herod was the puppet administrator of the region of Galilee (where Nazareth sits). Annas and Caiaphas were the high priests in the Jewish Temple. This is when John began baptizing. This happened.

About thirty years prior to John's preaching and baptizing, while Caesar Augustus was emperor of Rome, in a town of Bethlehem, five and a half miles from Jerusalem, a woman named Mary, whose husband was Joseph, gave birth to a child they named Jesus. This happened.

Yes, Jesus happened. In time and place. On this planet. The birth of Jesus Christ, the life and ministry of Jesus Christ, and, yes, His death and resurrection REALLY HAPPENED.

Jesus Christ is not a character in a fairy tale. His birth is not fiction. Real people knew Jesus, heard him, listened to him, loved Him. (Some other real people feared and felt threatened by Him.) Real people changed their lives to follow Him. Real people gave up everything, many times even their lives, to preach Him. Real people began a new way of living, a new way of believing in and worshipping God, a new way of loving, because of Him.

As we prepare for Christmas, let's make Jesus REAL in our lives, in our words, decisions, our values, in the way that we prepare, in the way that we communicate. Let's not treat Christmas like some cute storybook fantasy that we read once a year and then put it back on a shelf. Don't keep Jesus on a shelf, either. Jesus is not an elf. Jesus was real. Jesus Christ IS real. Our children and grandchildren need to know this. We need to know it, too, and live like we know it.

## THE IMMACULATE CONCEPTION OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY

The usual date for this important. Solemnity is December 8th. Because it falls on a Sunday this year, it is moved to Monday, December 9th. We will have two Masses celebrating this Feast — 9am and 5:30pm.

On this day the Church celebrates the grace of God which prepares Mary, from the moment of her conception in her mother's womb, to be the bearer of the Savior, the bearer of our salvation. As her cousin Elizabeth will say to her, "Blessed are you among women and blessed is the fruit of your womb!" Elizabeth goes on to ask in wonderment, "How does this happen to me, that the mother of my Lord should come to

me!" From this, the Church in its earliest days called Mary "Theotokos," which means "God-Bearer," the Mother of God. (Read more about this in the Catholic Catechism, #490-495)


