PILGRIMS OF HOPE PASSPORT



As you know, 2025 will be celebrated by Catholics around the world as a "Jubilee Year of Hope," and St. Joan of Arc has been selected as one of four Pilgrimage Parishes in the Diocese. As a Pilgrimage Parish, we will host events throughout the year that will be centered around the theme of HOPE.

Pilgrim Passports have been distributed and list planned events, suggested events and reflective journaling for each month with the "hope" of enriching your pilgrimage of faith.

SOLEMNITY OF THE BAPTISM OF OUR LORD / 2025



Dear Parishioners and Friends, Baptism is the Sacrament that makes us Christian. In Baptism we die to self and rise with Christ. We are incorporated into Christ; we become part of

the Body of Christ, the Church. Whether we are a month old or fifty, our walk with Christ, our pilgrimage of faith begins in Baptism.

Since pilgrimages are a big part of any Jubilee year, it might be appropriate and fun, during this Jubilee of Hope, to make a pilgrimage to the place where our walk with Jesus began — to the font in the Church where we were baptized! For some, this will be easier than others. If a real tour is impossible, try a virtual one. Go online and check out the place where baptismal promises were made for you. (If you can, find the date of your baptism ... we should all know this important date!)

In baptism, of course, we are given the light of Christ; we are invited to walk in the Light of Christ. During this Jubilee year, we might ask: how have we been a light of hope, of joy, of peace to others? Using some of the lingo of the day, what kind of "influencers" have we been? And who or what has influenced us? Has it been the Gospel or the culture (or something else) that has had a more profound impact upon our values, upon the choices and decisions we make?

We are blessed to have many baptisms here at St. Joan of Arc. Please keep all those who were baptized last year in your prayers. And pray for those who will be baptized this year. Pray that parents and Godparents take seriously their role, and their promise, to raise the newly baptized in the practice of the faith of the Church.






