

GOSPEL Luke 3:15-16, 21-22

There was a wedding at Cana in Galilee, and the mother of Jesus was there. Jesus and his disciples were also invited to the wedding. When the wine ran short, the mother of Jesus said to him, "They have no wine." And Jesus said to her, "Woman, how does your concern affect me? My hour has not yet come." His mother said to the servers, "Do whatever he tells you." Now there were six stone water jars there for Jewish ceremonial washings, each holding twenty to thirty gallons. Jesus told them, "Fill the jars with water." So they filled them to the brim. Then he told them, "Draw some out now and take it to the headwaiter." So they took it. And when the headwaiter tasted the water that had become wine, without knowing where it came from — although the servers who had drawn the water knew —, the headwaiter called the bridegroom and said to him, "Everyone serves good wine first, and then when people have drunk freely, an inferior one; but you have kept the good wine until now." Jesus did this as the beginning of his signs at Cana in Galilee and so revealed his glory, and his disciples began to believe in him. For this weekend's readings, click here.





SECOND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME/2025 GO RIGHT TO EASTER

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

Today we hear of Jesus' first public miracle: the turning of water to wine at the marriage feast in Cana. In John's Gospel, miracles are called "signs" because they point out, show, reveal, Christ's divinity. Interestingly, in more than one way this first sign points to the ultimate of "miracles," the resurrection of Christ Jesus! For example, notice:

"On the third day there was a wedding ..." On the third day is as big a clue .

Where was this wedding? "In Cana in Galilee." Galilee is where the resurrected Christ meets His disciples.

Who is at the wedding? "The mother of Jesus was there." That's Mary. "His disciples were also invited." The disciples. They represent the New Israel. Mary is the mother of the Church. The Church, pre-figured, is gathered with Jesus at this wedding, as they will also be gathered at His resurrection and the giving of His Holy Spirit (Pentecost).

What happens at this wedding? "... the wine ran short." Wine is a symbol for joy and fellowship (unity), the source of which is, of course, God. Without a connection to God's life there is dryness of life, listlessness, brokenness. This is sin: separation. Only God can repair this ... and this is exactly what God does in Jesus Christ, Messiah and Savior.

Mary tells the wine stewards to listen to Jesus and to "do whatever He tells you." Jesus tells them to fill to the brim six stone water jars (roughly 180 gallons) with water. This water is turned into wine ... an abundance of life and joy which will enable the people to gather together and continue to celebrate a feast of love and union (a wedding!) together. This, of course, is what Jesus does in His dying and rising.

Christ's resurrection is a wedding of Heaven and earth. Christ Himself is a wedding of divine and human. What sin separates, God makes one! This is cause for great rejoicing! This is what is celebrated in each and every Mass, in the Eucharist, when bread and wine is changed into the Body and Blood of Christ.

It was only seven days ago that we took down our Christmas nativity, but already the Church wants us, at least for a Sunday, to skip over weeks of Ordinary Time and forty days of Lent and go directly to Easter! As pilgrims, it is always good to know where we are going!

Except for 2020, the COVID year, our Sacramental numbers do not fluctuate greatly. Baptisms remain very high. Our number of Confirmations has slipped a bit from 2019. It is important to keep our young people active and involved in their Catholic Faith. Please continue to bring your junior high and high school-aged children to Mass!

The number of weddings in 2024 is in the same ballpark as previous years. It should be noted that nearly half of 2024's weddings (14) were Convalidations, commonly called Church Blessings. Please encourage your children and grandchildren to speak to Fr. Rich or Fr. JM if they are considering a "destination wedding"; there are many options for them to have their marriage recognized as a Sacrament.

It is wonderful to see that since 2020 Mass attendance has been rising steadily each year— although we are still a bit shy of the 2019 number. Let's all keep talking up Mass— especially if you know people who have drifted away since COVID.

It is probably important to note that in 2019 we had three priests and four deacons on Staff. So, while the Sacramental numbers have remained steady, we have now two assigned priests, one deacon and two retired deacons who assist when able to. Fr. Richard Regan, a retired Air Force Chaplain, who for nearly 15 years has helped us with weekend liturgies, continues to deal with the effects of Parkinson's Disease. We are hopeful that he will be back celebrating Mass soon. Please continue to keep Fr. Richard in your prayers.

These numbers tell us that we are a vibrant parish Sacramentally. Celebrating God's presence in our lives every Sunday is the most important thing that we do. The Eucharist gives us life and strength and joy to live our Christian discipleship. We are blessed to have so many parishioners involved in the planning and celebrating of Sunday Mass, as well as the other Sacraments. Parishioners serve as **First Communion and Confirmation catechists** (teachers), as members of our **Pre-Baptismal Workshop** (Bundle of Joy) and **Pre-Cana (wedding) team**, as **Funeral planners** and **Consolation Ministers** on the day of the Funeral Mass. Of course on Sunday, parishioners serve in the many various **liturgical ministries**. If God is calling you to serve in any of the above ways, please give the Office a call (856.983.0077).


Sunday, February 2nd at Noon Mass


