

GOSPEL

Matthew 2:1-12

When Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea, in the days of King Herod, behold, magi from the east arrived in Jerusalem, saying, "Where is the newborn king of the Jews? We saw his star at its rising and have come to do him homage." When King Herod heard this, he was greatly troubled, and all Jerusalem with him. Assembling all the chief priests and the scribes of the people, he inquired of them where the Christ was to be born. They said to him, "In Bethlehem of Judea, for thus it has been written through the prophet: And you, Bethlehem, land of Judah, are by no means least among the rulers of Judah; since from you shall come a ruler, who is to shepherd my people Israel." Then Herod called the magi secretly and ascertained from them the time of the star's appearance. He sent them to Bethlehem and said, "Go and search diligently for the child. When you have found him, bring me word, that I too may go and do him homage." After their audience with the king they set out. And behold, the star that they had seen at its rising preceded them, until it came and stopped over the place where the child was. They were overjoyed at seeing the star, and on entering the house they saw the child with Mary his mother. They prostrated themselves and did him homage. Then they opened their treasures and offered him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. And having been warned in a dream not to return to Herod, they departed for their country by another way.

SOLEMNITY OF THE EPIPHANY OF OUR LORD/ 2025 JOURNEY OF HOPE

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

Epiphany was the name of the first parish I served in many years ago as an associate pastor; one of the reasons this Feast has held a special place in my heart. I am not alone.

Many people through the generations of Christianity have been captivated by the details of the great visit of the Magi (or Kings, Wise Men) to the manger of the infant Savior of the world. Included in this visit told only in the Gospel of Matthew are the powerful images of the sharing of gifts, the long journey following a star, and the encounter with King Herod. I read recently that the Magi are depicted in art more than any Gospel figure, except, of course, for Jesus himself and His mother, the Virgin Mary.

What stands out in the visit of the Magi for you? Which parts of the story touch your heart? What does this story tell you about who Jesus is? How does it speak to your own faith journey, your walk with the Lord?

I love the smallness and simplicity of Christmas ... a tiny baby born outside in the backyard in an obscure barn, placed in a feeding trough for animals, visited by poor shepherds, Mary and Joseph by Jesus' side. When it comes to Epiphany, I love its grandeur, its bigness: a star shining in the vast galaxy, mystical visitors, Magi, astrologers from the east representing all races on the earth who "traverse afar," bearing gifts that tell of the significance, the identity of this child: Gold (Jesus is King, Lord of Lords); Frankincense (Jesus is fully divine, the only begotten Son of God); Myrrh (Jesus is the Suffering Servant who will give His life to save the world).

It is wonderful that this First Sunday in our 2025
Jubilee Year celebrates Epiphany. Like the Magi, we are
Pilgrims of Hope on a journey to find Christ, to encounter
God's love, to offer our lives as a gift in gratitude for all that
has been given to us. As we begin this year, this sacred
pilgrimage, let us walk together and be for each other signs of
hope!
