

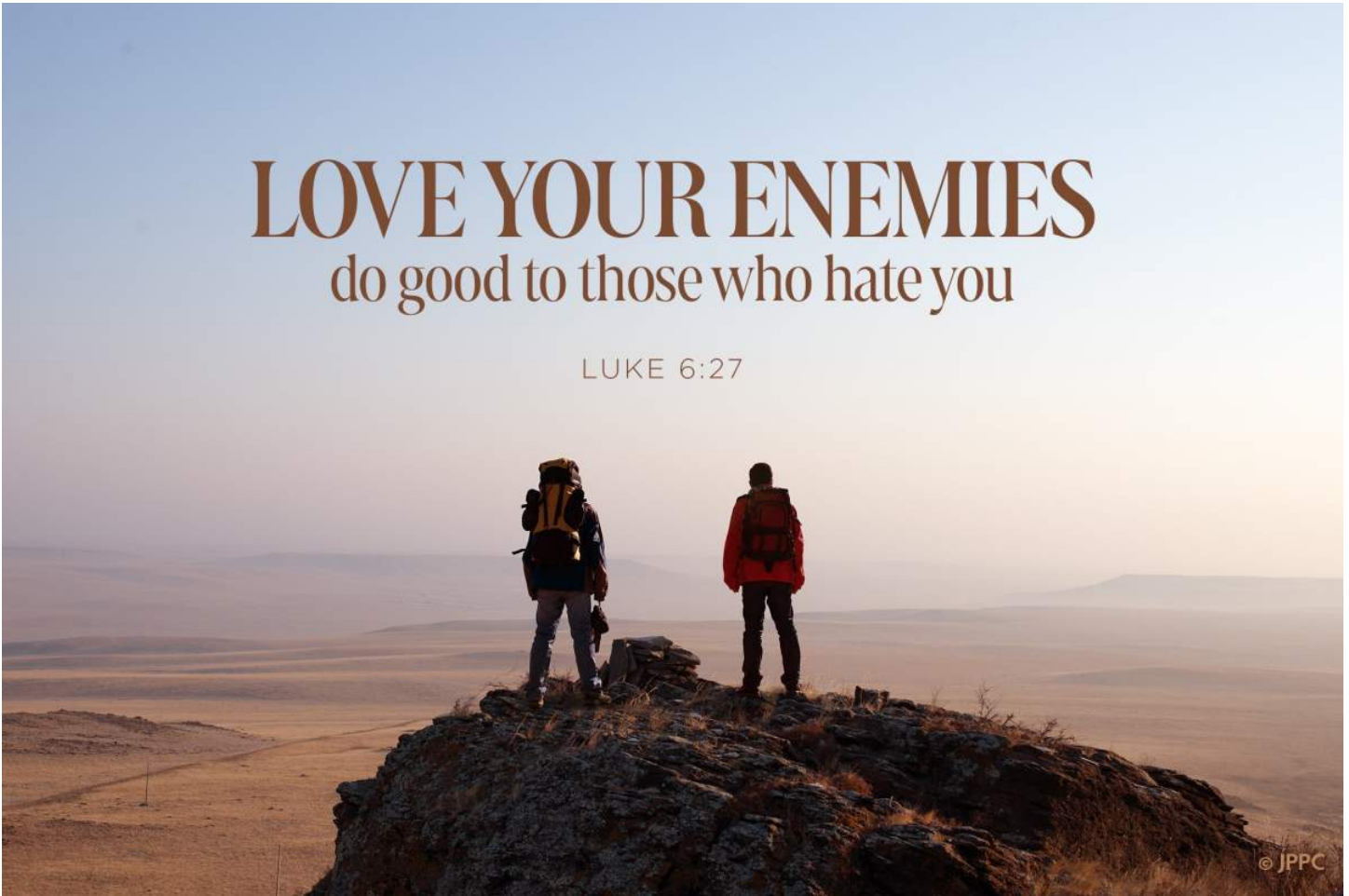

GOSPEL Luke 6:27-38

Jesus said to his disciples: "To you who hear I say, love your enemies, do good to those who hate you, bless those who curse you, pray for those who mistreat you. To the person who strikes you on one cheek, offer the other one as well, and from the person who takes your cloak, do not withhold even your tunic. Give to everyone who asks of you, and from the one who takes what is yours do not demand it back. Do to others as you would have them do to you. For if you love those who love you, what credit is that to you? Even sinners love those who love them. And if you do good to those who do good to you, what credit is that to you? Even sinners do the same.

If you lend money to those from whom you expect repayment, what credit is that to you? Even sinners lend to sinners, and get back the same amount. But rather, love your enemies and do good to them, and lend expecting nothing back; then your reward will be great and you will be children of the Most High, for he himself is kind to the ungrateful and the wicked. Be merciful, just as your Father is merciful.

"Stop judging and you will not be judged. Stop condemning and you will not be condemned. Forgive and you will be forgiven. Give, and gifts will be given to you; a good measure, packed together, shaken down, and overflowing, will be poured into your lap. WHAT WE DO TOGETHER

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

We are called to be disciples of Christ, not simply members of a parish. However, we do live out our discipleship in the context of a parish community. Thank you for sharing your gifts of time, talent, and treasure with this faith community we call the Church of St. Joan of Arc.

I am amazed at all that happens during any given week here at our parish. For instance, just recently from February 8-15, just 8 days, in addition to our 5 Sunday Masses (attended by over 2000 people), 4 babies were baptized, 1 happy couple was married and, sadly, 7 people were buried. Our Korean Community also celebrated a Sunday Mass in their native tongue. During the week, over 330 children attended our Elementary School and over 800 attended Religious Education classes. Second Graders attended a Saturday First Reconciliation Retreat (their parents went to a prep meeting on Monday). Our WINGS Youth Group attended a Diocesan Youth Conference. Many parish groups met during the week: Accompanying One Another (support for those with addictions), Evangelization Team, Scouts, Divorced and Separated Ministry, Caritas Heart to Heart (support for parents of special needs children), Wednesday Morning Faith Group, Abide in Me Intercessory Prayer Ministry, Monday Night Bible Study, 3 sessions of Walking with Purpose (Bible Study for women), Bundle of Joy Baptism Preparation, OCIA (Order of Christian Initiation of Adults); Love in Action (Life, Justice and Creation Ministry), TMIY (That Man Is You – men's faith sharing), Blaze (Bible study for junior high school girls), VIRTUS Certification Meeting, Caritas Valentine's Day Dance (for young people with special needs), and Catechesis training. In addition, people came to the parish office for individual counseling, confession, annulment advocacy, funeral preparation, marriage preparation, and Mass cards. There were 4 requests for Helping Hands. 8 sick calls with anointing were made. Also: 8 weekday Masses. Morning Prayer on Monday, Wednesday, Friday. Tuesday Eucharistic Adoration.

Except for the 7 funerals (thankfully we usually have less), this was a fairly typical week. If I left something out, I apologize. Of course, none of this happens without people who love God coming together to share their faith and time and gifts in order to put "flesh" on our parish mission: to do what Jesus did — to celebrate, proclaim, and share the love of God with *everyone*.

All of this also happens because of the sacrificial giving of our parishioners. Your offering each Sunday is vital to the mission of our parish. As I said last week at each Mass, thank you for your generous offering either in the Collection Boxes or through online giving. As I did last week, I encourage everyone to prayerfully consider your weekly offering to the parish. Times are tough for many people; those who are able to increase their weekly giving are encouraged to do so. As disciples of Christ let us all ask the Holy Spirit to help us share our time, talent, and treasure as best as we are able here at St. Joan of Arc. Thank you for all that you do!

CREATION CARE AND RESPECT LIFE: A CONNECTION

LOVE IN ACTION: Justice Corner

Sister Norma Pimentel is a Sister with the Missionaries of Jesus, and has been Executive Director of Catholic Charities in the Rio Grande Valley of Texas for 12 years. She began working with refugees in 1980 at Casa Oscar Romero, and it has become her life's passion. Since then, she has shown compassion to immigrants entering the United States from the Texas-Mexico border. She has provided food, shelter and other necessities to countless individuals and families for decades. She has been featured on 20/20, CNN and 60 Minutes, and Time magazine named her one of the most influential people in 2020. In 2018, Notre Dame University granted her an award and she was also given the Hispanic Heritage Award for Service. She even came and spoke in the Diocese of Trenton a few years ago. She has a strong working relationship with Bishop Daniel Flores of Brownsville, TX; and she has been praised by Pope Francis for her humanitarian work.

Dear Parishioners,

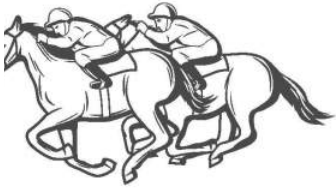
