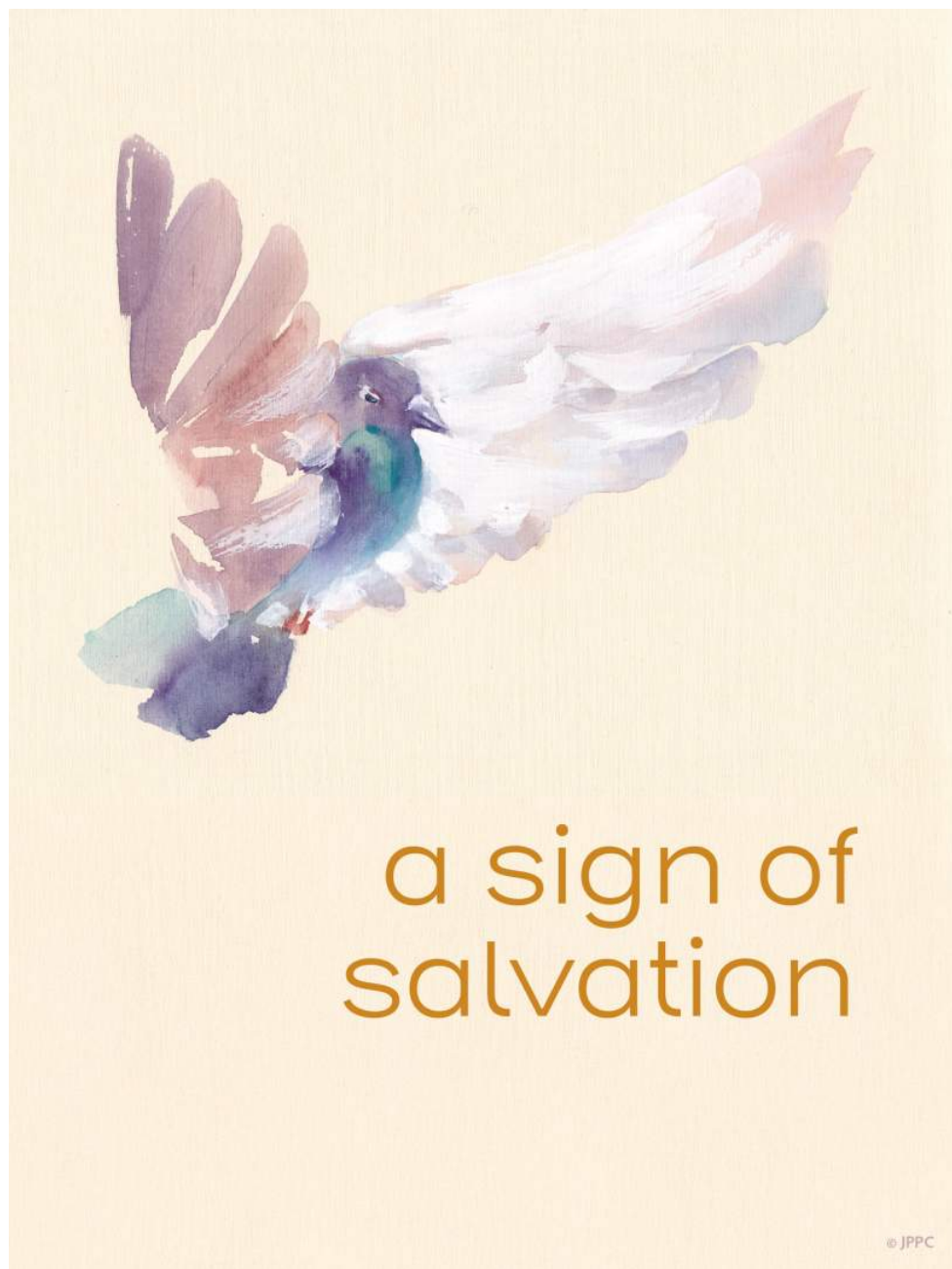

GOSPEL

Luke 2:22-40

When the days were completed for their purification according to the law of Moses, Mary and Joseph took Jesus up to Jerusalem to present him to the Lord, just as it is written in the law of the Lord, Every male that opens the womb shall be consecrated to the Lord, and to offer the sacrifice of a pair of turtledoves or two young pigeons, in accordance with the dictate in the law of the Lord.

Now there was a man in Jerusalem whose name was Simeon. This man was righteous and devout, awaiting the consolation of Israel, and the Holy Spirit was upon him. It had been revealed to him by the Holy Spirit that he should not see death before he had seen the Christ of the Lord. He came in the Spirit into the temple; and when the parents brought in the child Jesus to perform the custom of the law in regard to him, he took him into his arms and blessed God, saying:

“Now, Master, you may let your servant go in peace, according to your word, for my eyes have seen your salvation, which you prepared in the sight of all the peoples: a light for revelation to the Gentiles, and glory for your people Israel.”

The child’s father and mother were amazed at what was said about him; and Simeon blessed them and said to Mary his mother, “Behold, this child is destined for the fall and rise of many in Israel, and to be a sign that will be contradicted -and you yourself a sword will pierce- so that the thoughts of many hearts may be revealed.” There was also a prophetess, Anna, the daughter of Phanuel, of the tribe of Asher. She was advanced in years, having lived seven years with her husband after her marriage, and then as a widow until she was eighty-four. She never left the temple, but worshiped night and day with fasting and prayer. And coming forward at that very time, she gave thanks to God and spoke about the child to all who were awaiting the redemption of Jerusalem.

When they had fulfilled all the prescriptions of the law of the Lord, they returned to Galilee, to their own town of Nazareth. The child grew and became strong, filled with wisdom; and the favor of God was upon him.

NO GROUNDHOG IN HERE

Dear Pilgrims of Hope,

We find today another example of how we live as Catholic Christians according to a different calendar. While most of the country is focused on the tradition of a rodent (is a groundhog a rodent?) popping up from a hole in the ground (or being dragged out which often seems the case), we are focused on another tradition. Today is the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord Jesus, when Mary and Joseph bring Him to the Temple, themselves participating in a long faith tradition.



Today’s Solemnity (the highest rank we give to a feast day) marks the 40th day since Christmas. It is, in some ways, yet another epiphany, another revealing of Jesus, as two faithful members of the Temple, Simeon and Anna, behold the child and declare Him to be the Messiah, the long-awaited One, the One anointed by God, the One to set Israel free, the Savior of the world..

Before paper calendars, and long before digital ones, this is how Christians told their time, by the Liturgical Calendar, the Church Calendar, the cycle of saints days and feasts of the Lord Jesus. These feasts were the people’s catechism, they taught them their faith and the life of Christ. They also built community and a sense of identity; they helped people to know to whom they belonged.

We need these traditions. We need to keep them alive. We need to talk about the life of Christ with our children and grandchildren. It is in Christ that we find our true meaning in this life. And while a groundhog might give us the hope of an early spring, it is Christ that gives us the hope of eternal life.

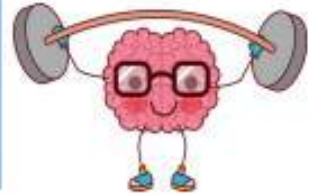

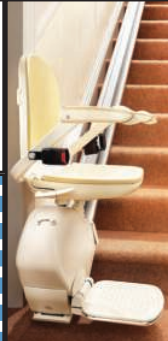
