EXODUS AND JESUS

Dear Pilgrims, all!

This Sunday the Gospel takes us up a mountain but in many ways we are still in the desert!

On this mountain, Jesus is transfigured and appears conversing with Moses and Elijah. Only in St. Luke's account do we get a glimpse into what their conversation is all about. In a word: exodus!

Jesus' exodus!

It is impossible to understand Jesus' mission without understanding the exodus event from the Hebrew Scriptures (Old Testament) when Moses led the people through the desert into the promised land. Jesus Christ is the new Moses whose Exodus (His death, resurrection and ascension) leads us to the new promised land which is, of course, eternal life. We commemorate this new Exodus every time we celebrate the Eucharist, which is the new Passover meal in which we partake in “bread from heaven,” that is, Jesus Christ Himself, who is the Lamb of God.

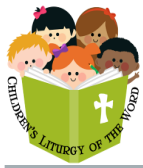

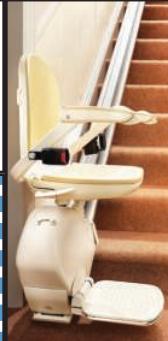
