GOSPEL John 8:1-11

Jesus went to the Mount of Olives. But early in the morning he arrived again in the temple area, and all the people started coming to him, and he sat down and taught them.

Then the scribes and the Pharisees brought a woman who had been caught in adultery and made her stand in the middle.

They said to him, "Teacher, this woman was caught in the very act of committing adultery. Now in the law, Moses commanded us to stone such women. So what do you say?"

They said this to test him, so that they could have some charge to bring against him.

Jesus bent down and began to write on the ground with his finger. But when they continued asking him, he straightened up and said to them,

"Let the one among you who is without sin be the first to throw a stone at her."

Again he bent down and wrote on the ground. And in response, they went away one by one, beginning with the elders. So he was left alone with the woman before him.

Then Jesus straightened up and said to her, "Woman, where are they? Has no one condemned you?"

She replied, "No one, sir."

Then Jesus said, "Neither do I condemn you. Go, and from now on do not sin any more."

THE DAYS THAT GIVE US HOPE:

An Intro to the Days of the Sacred Easter Triduum

Wednesday, April 9th, 7pm

Pedata Hall

Fr. Rich will lead us day by day through the three most important days of our year and of our lives: **Holy Thursday, Good Friday, Holy Saturday and Easter Sunday.** If you are counting and come up with four days, you need to come! All during Lent we have been praying for people who need hope, praying too that we ourselves become persons of hope. These are the days that give us that hope: the Easter (Paschal) Triduum. Please join us, even if you have heard the talk before (Fr. Rich says this year will be different). Your Holy Week and Easter will be enriched.

Fifth Sunday in Lent 2025

STONE AND SAND

Dear Pilgrims of Hope,

Our Lenten journey brings us a very familiar story today. A woman caught in the act of adultery is about to be stoned for her sin. The Stoners appeal to Scripture, to Moses, to the law, to justify what they are about to do. Jesus says, okay, sure, go ahead, throw a stone at her but the one among you who has no sins should be the first to throw it. They drop their rocks and head for home (no doubt to figure out what they want to throw at Jesus). When they are alone, Jesus tells the woman he does not condemn her. No stones from Jesus. Only love, mercy, compassion, the things she needs to live a new life as He challenges her to sin no more. There it is. A story of incredible mercy.

But most of us, including me, get stuck on one small detail I left out. Before Jesus addresses the crowd of Holy Stoners, he bends down and writes in the sand. Most of us get stuck here with this detail. What the heck is Jesus doing? What is He writing? We can spend a whole hour of Bible Study on that point — wondering about something that we are not told. One Biblical commentator suggests that if it had been important, what Jesus was writing, the Gospel writer would have told us. What we are told that Jesus writes in the sand. The act of the writing is the important thing.

Jesus' finger is the finger of God. Jesus gives us a new law, a New Covenant, based on love and relationship, just as it was the finger of God that inscribed on stone the Ten Commandments, the first Covenant based on the Law. (Exodus 31:18).

God, through Jesus, is teaching us something new. Better for us all, better for the world, better too for the Church, if we focus on what Jesus is teaching us in His encounter with the adulterous woman; better for our future if we not waste time speculating on what Jesus wrote in the sand, but spend more time allowing Jesus to write on our hearts.

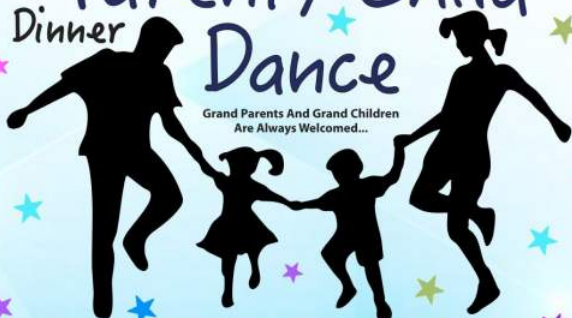
